#### NOTICE.

Colonial Secretary's Office, Wellington, 6th April, 1848.

COMPLAINTS having been made of the mode in which the Government brig has been employed in carrying passengers from one settlement to another, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor directs it to be notified for general information, that the following Regulations with respect to such passages, (when the Brig is not exclusively required for the service of Government) will in future be strictly enforced and must be adhered to.

1st. All applications for passages must be made, at Wellington, to the Colonial Secretary: at Nelson, to his Honor the Superintendent; and at Wanganui, or other Settlements, to the Resident Magistrate. A written order must be obtained in every case.

2nd. All such applications must be made within 36 hours after the arrival of

the Brig.
3rd. The Passage Money, according to the scale given below, must be paid into the Colonial Treasury, and the receipt granted for the same will be the order for

the passage. 4th. The passenger must endorse the receipt on leaving the vessel.

5th. The rate of Passage Money is for the present as follows:-

THE Regulations of the Colonial Hospital for the admission of patients of European origin being conti-nually neglected by applicants, who are in the habit of resorting on writing in the first instance to His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor or the Colonial Secretary, thereby creating delays which in some cases might be dangerous, and in all must be inconvenient to themselves, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor directs it to. be notified for public information, that the proper course to be adopted by any such applicant is to repair in the first instance. to the Cotonial Surgeon, who will furnish him with a written memorandum, stating whether the case is one which requires admission, and whether there is room in the This memorandum the applicant should then take to the Resident Magistrate, who will endorse thereon a statement to the best of his knowledge of the circumstances of the applicant, and his. spiliturer otherwise to provide medical aid for himself or pay the whole or a part of the cost of that which he obtains at the. Hospital. These conditions being complied with, and the reports of the beforementioned officers being satisfactory, His. Excellency will then, as a matter of course, append to the document an order for the patient's admission.

In cases of severe accident, or sudden. and dangerous illness, any one in pauper circumstances will be at once admitted into the Hospital, (none of the foregoing steps being necessary) if there is room. and if not, the Colonial Surgeon will examine into and prescribe for the case.
