PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency EDWARD JOHN BYRN, Esquire, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS the undermentioned Ordinances enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster, in the Islands of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, were passed in the twelfth and thirteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, viz.

No. 5. An Ordinance to confer upon the Lieutenant-Governor of New Munster, within the Province, the same powers in certain cases as are conferred on the Officer administering the Government of the colony for the time being. (16th June, 1849.)

No. 6. An Ordinance to provide a cheap and expeditious mode of procedure against persons occupying land or premises within the Province of New Munster without right, title, or license. (16th June, 1849.)

No. 7. An Ordinance to authorize the levying and collecting of Rates, for the making and repairing of Roads, Streets, &c., &c., in any town in the Province of New Munster. (16th June, 1849.)

No. 8. An Ordinance to appropriate the Revenue for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-nine—fifty. (22nd June, 1849.)

No. 9. An Ordinance to increase the efficiency of the Constabulary Force. (22nd June, 1849.)

No. 10. An Ordinance to authorize the levying and collection of Tolls on Roads, and of Rates on Land, in the

Province of New Munster. (28th June, 1849.)

No. 11. An Ordinance to abate the Dog Nuisance. (28th June, 1849.)

Which Ordinances having, in accordance with the requirements of Clause 11 of the "Provincial Councils Ordinance," been referred to the Governor-in-Chief, and sanctioned by His Excellency, have now received the Lieutenant-Governor's assent.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

THE HEADS of the several religious denominations in this Province named in Ordinance of Council No. 10, of Session 8, are hereby requested to transmit to this Office, on or before the 1st of January, 1850, a list of all Teachers employed in connection with their Church, in instructing Aboriginal Natives or Half Castes at Day Schools, distinguishing Native from European Teachers; stating the localities at which such Teachers are stationed; their names, and the dates of the commencement of their labours as daily instructors at such Schools, together with the average number of Native or Half-Caste children of each sex, separately specified, attending at each School for the three months previous to the date of the return.

These returns are required in order that a sum of Five Hundred Pounds, which has been recommended to be appropriated by the Executive Council of this Province under the "Education Ordinance" for the benefit of Aboriginal Natives and Half-Castes only, may be properly apportioned by the Council amongst the heads of the several denominations referred to in the Ordinance.

No Sunday Schools, or Teachers of Sunday Schools only, to be included in the return, but only Day Schools and Daily Teachers.

Boys' Schools should be classed separately, and the same particulars stated as are required with regard to Day Schools, and any other information which may be thought interesting or useful in relation to the subject.
