PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Edward John Eyre, Esquire, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance passed by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Session 1, No. 9, intituled "An Ordinance to increase the efficiency of the Constabulary Force," it is enacted, that "the provisions of this Ordinance shall immediately be in force within such limits of the Town of Wellington, as marked on the Map of the Surveyor-General of the New Zealand Company, as the Lieutenant-Governor with the advice of the Executive Council may proclaim."

Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster,

aforesaid, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the hereinbefore in part recited Ordinance, shall come into operation within the limits of the Town of Wellington, as laid down in the Map of the Surveyor-General of the New Zealand Company aforesaid, from and after the date hereof.

Given under my Hand, and Issued under the Public Seal of the Province of New Munster, in the Islands of New Zealand, at Government House, at Wellington, this 22nd day of May, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

WHEREAS, numerous complaints have been made at this Court of damage done to Gardens and other Enclosures, by Cattle wandering at large: *This is to give notice*, that the police are instructed to inform against any person, whose cattle shall, from and after the first day of June next, be found wandering at large in any street, or public place within the limits of the Town of Wellington.

By the Cattle Trespass Ordinance, Session 7, No. 17, the Owner of any horned or neat cattle, Horses, Mules, Asses, Sheep, Goats, and Swine, is liable to forfeit any sum, not exceeding, five shillings, for every head of such cattle found wandering at large in any street, or public place within the limits of any Town, or Village which shall be proclaimed, by His Excellency the Governor, to come within the operation of this Ordinance. Dated at the Resident Magistrates Court, Wellington, this sixteenth day of May, 1850.
