TO ALL to whom these presents shall come, I, Sir George Grey, a Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, send Greeting:

WHEREAS, by an Act made and enacted in the Parliament holden in the 9th and 10th Years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "*An Act to grant certain Powers to the New Zealand Company,*" after reciting that divers Land Orders or Contracts for Sale and Conveyances of Lands, &c., in New Zealand had been issued and made by the said Company, but as to which no Conveyances had then been required, and from deaths of and dealings by purchasers, various and conflicting claims to Conveyances, and such Land Orders or Contracts might arise, it is amongst other things enacted that a Conveyance by the Company or their Trustees, in whom the same shall be vested, of the lands, &c., and to which any such Land Orders or Contracts shall relate for the Estate and Interest thereby contracted to be conveyed remaining unexpired or undetermined at the time of the conveyance to the Purchaser or Purchasers named in such Land Order or Contract on his, her or their request, or to any person or persons deriving Title from, through, or under such purchaser or purchasers on the

request of such person or persons, and on proof of his, her, or their Title to the satisfaction (if the Conveyance shall be required in New Zealand) of a Nominee or Nominees of the Company, approved of by the Acting Governor of the Colony for the time being, in writing, Registered according to the Laws for the time being in force for the Registration of Deeds, &c. in the Colony, shall be deemed a full and complete performance by the Company of the Contract or obligation contained in or resulting from such Land Order, to convey the said Lands, &c. AND WHEREAS, by an Instrument in writing under the Seal of the New Zealand Company, and bearing date the 28th day of September, 1849, the said Company did nominate, constitute, and appoint, William Fox of Wellington, in New Zealand, Esquire, or other their Chief Agent for the time being, resident in New Zealand, Francis Dillon Bell of Nelson, New Zealand, Esquire, William Halse of New Plymouth, in New Zealand, Esquire, James Kelham, of Wellington, aforesaid, Esquire, and Francis Jollie of Nelson, aforesaid, Esquire, or any two of them, to be their Nominees for the purpose of performing all singular the powers relative to such investigation and proof of Title as aforesaid. Now these Presents Witness

that I, the said Governor of New Zealand, pursuant to the power and authority in me vested for that purpose by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby approve of the said Nominees of the New Zealand Company.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, K. C. B., Governor-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by a Proclamation bearing date the 18th day of January, 1844, the Colony of New Zealand, for the purposes of the Ordinance for establishing a Supreme Court, was divided into two districts by the name of the Northern and Southern Districts:

And whereas it is expedient that the Southern District should be subdivided:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, pursuant to the authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby proclaim and declare that that part of the Colony of New Zealand heretofore included within such Southern District shall, for the purposes

of the said Ordinance, be divided into two districts, to be called the Middle and Southern Districts.

And I do hereby proclaim and declare that the Middle District shall include all that portion of the Northern Island of New Ulster lying to the southward of a line commencing from a point on the coast two miles in a straight line southward of the mouth of the River Wairoa, in Hawke's Bay; thence in a straight line to the highest summit of the mountain usually called Tongariro; thence along the highest ridge lying between that mountain and the summit of Mount Egmont; from the summit of Mount Egmont to the source of Otu Matua to the sea; and all that portion of the Island of New Munster lying to the northward of the 42 degree of south latitude, and also so much of the sea adjacent thereto as lies within the jurisdiction of the Vice Admiral of New Zealand.

And that the Southern District shall include all that portion of the Colony of New Zealand which lies to the southward of the 42 degree of south latitude, together with so much of the sea adjacent thereto as lies within the jurisdiction of the Vice Admiral of New Zealand.

And whereas, by the said Supreme Court Ordinance, the Governor is empowered to assign to each of the districts into which the Colony may be divided, a Judge or Judges, who shall have within the same all the powers and jurisdiction thereby given to the Supreme Court:

Now therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of such authority, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have assigned to the Middle District, HENRY SAMUEL CHAPMAN, Esq., Judge of the Supreme Court; and to the Southern District, SIDNEY STEPHEN, Esq., Judge of the Supreme Court.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir George Grey, K.C.B., Governor-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the High Court of Admiralty, bearing date the thirtieth day of December, in the Year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain, constitute, and appoint me, Sir GEORGE GREY, K.C.B., to be Her Majesty's Vice Admiral, Commissary and Deputy, in the Office of Vice Admiralty, in the said Islands of New Zealand, and Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and territories thereon depending; to take cognizance of, and proceed in, all cases, civil and maritime, and in complaints, contracts, offences, or suspected offences, crimes, pleas, debts, &c., &c., within the maritime jurisdiction of the Vice Admiralty of the said Islands of New Zealand, and Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and territories depending on the same, to hear and determine the same according to the rights, statutes, laws, and ordinances, and customs anciently observed; with power of deputing and surrogating in any place, for the premises, one or more deputy or deputies:—

Now I, the Governor-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority in me vested in that behalf, do hereby appoint

HENRY SAMUEL CHAPMAN, Esq.,

a Judge of the Supreme Court, my Deputy in and for the Middle District of the Province of New Munster, and

SIDNEY STEPHEN, Esq.,

a Judge of the said Supreme Court, my Deputy in and for the Southern District of the said Province of New Munster, with full power to take cognizance of, and proceed in all matters, and to hear and determine the same in manner prescribed by the said recited Letters Patent.
