PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency EDWARD JOHN ERRE, Esquire, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance of the Legislative Council of New Zealand, Session 8, No. 5, intituled the "Slaughter House Ordinance," and by an Ordinance of the Provincial Legislative Council of New Munster, Session 1, No. 15, intituled the "Empowering Ordinance," His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor is authorized by Proclamation from time to time to constitute and define certain districts for the purpose of regulating the slaughtering of Cattle.

AND WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the 24th May, 1848, the Town of Wellington, as laid down in the authorized Plans of the New Zealand Company was declared to come within the operation of the aforesaid Ordinance.

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to extend the limits of such operation.

Now Therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster, in pursuance of the powers by the said Ordinances in me vested, do hereby declare

that the whole of the districts of Porirua and Port Nicholson within the limits delineated and described in the Plans attached to the Crown Grants of these districts respectively and entered of record in the Office of the Colonial Secretary at Wellington, that is to say, the whole Tract between the sea, the Northern boundary line of the Porirua block, and the Turakirai Ranges, (or the Eastern boundary-line of the Port Nicholson block) shall, from and after the date hereof form a district for the purposes of the aforesaid Ordinance to regulate the slaughtering of Cattle.

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the Province of New Munster in the Islands of New Zealand at Government House at Wellington this twenty-first day of November in the Year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency, EDWARD JOHN EYRE, Esquire, Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster, in the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of New Munster, and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, intituled "An Ordinance to increase the efficiency of the Constabulary Force," Session 1, No. 9, it is declared that it shall be lawful for the Lieutenant Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, to specify any limits of Towns within which any provisions of the aforesaid Ordinance shall be enforced, upon a requisition to that effect from a majority of the Magistrates of the District in which such Town is situate.

AND WHEREAS a majority of the Magistrates of the District of Whanganui have made a request that the 10th clause of the said Ordinance should be enforced within the limits of the Town of Petre.

NOW THEREFORE I, the Lieutenant-Governor of New Munster, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby declare that the said clause of the aforesaid Ordinance shall from and after the date hereof, be enforced within the original limits of the Town of Petre, as the same are laid down in the certified copy of the New Zealand Company's plan of the said Town, filed in the Office of the Colonial Secretary of New Munster.
