## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, a Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, Session VIII, No. 9, intituled "An Ordinance for Registering Births, Deaths, and Marriages in the Colony of New Zealand," it is enacted that for the purposes of the said Ordinance it shall be lawful for the Governor by Proclamation to be for that purpose issued, to divide the Colony of New Zealand into

such and so many districts as he shall think fit, and every such District shall be called by a distinct name, and shall be a Deputy Registrar's District; Provided always, that it shall be lawful for the Governor to revoke such Proclamation, and to issue from time to time a new Proclamation, dividing the Colony anew, into such and so many districts as he shall think fit."

And whereas, by Proclamations dated the 15th May, 1848, and the 29th November, 1848, the Province of New Munster was divided into certain districts, to be the Deputy Registrar's district thereof:

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the Province of New Munster, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said in part recited Ordinance, do hereby revoke so much of the said Proclamations as relates to the Boundaries of the District of Wellington, in the said Province of New Munster and I hereby appoint and declare that the said District of Wellington shall be divided into two districts the names and boundaries of which shall, for the present, be as follows:

## District of Whanganui.

All that part of the District of Wellington (as the same is described in the aforesaid Proclamation of the 15th May, 1848,) which is bounded on the North by the line dividing the Province of New Ulster, from New Munster, on the East by the Rua Wahine Range, on the South by the Manawatu River, and on the West by the Sea, shall be called the District of Whangarui and shall be the district of the Deputy Registrar thereof, for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

### District of Wellington.

The remainder of the said District of Wellington as described in the Proclamation of the 15th May, aforesaid, shall be called the district of Wellington, and shall be the district of the Deputy Registrar thereof, for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

Given under my hand, and issued under the public seal of the Province of New Munster, in the Islands of New Zealand, at Govern-(L.S.) ment House, at Wellington, this minth day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

LIGHT AT THE MOUTH OF NELSON HAR-BOUR.

THE NELSON HARBOUR LIGHT will be known to Mariners as a fixed Red Light. The light will be visible in a south direction from N.N.W. round to N.N.E.; the lantern is elevated 160 feet above the level of the sea, but the light being red will not be seen at a greater distance than about eight miles, and at a lesser distance, according to the state of the atmosphere.

Vessels running down the Bay should bring the light to bear S.S.E., with the lead going until they get within 7 fathoms, when they should anchor, and wait for a a Pilot. The light is in south lat. 41deg., 15min., 30sec., and E. long. 173deg., 16min., 5sec.
