PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, a Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor & Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance enacted by the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Session III, No. 1, intituled "*An Ordinance for establishing a Supreme Court*," the Governor of New Zealand is empowered, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation from time to time, to divide the Colony into Districts for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and the limits of such

Districts from time to time to alter as occasion may require :

And whereas, by Proclamations dated respectively the eighteenth of January 1844, and the seventh of November 1845, the Colony of New Zealand was divided into two Districts for the purposes aforesaid, named respectively the Northern and Southern Districts, the boundaries whereof were set forth in the said Proclamations :

And whereas, by Proclamation dated the thirtieth day of July 1850, the Southern District of the Supreme Court was sub-divided into two Districts therein defined, named respectively the Middle and Southern Districts :

And whereas, it is expedient that the said last named Proclamation should be revoked :

Now therefore, I, the Governor-in-Chief do hereby revoke the said Procla-

mation of the thirtieth day of July 1850 accordingly :

And whereas, by the said "Supreme Court Ordinance," the Governor is empowered to assign to each of the Districts into which the Colony may be divided, a Judge or Judges, who shall have within the same all the powers and jurisdiction thereby given to the Supreme Court :

Now therefore, I, the Governor, in pursuance of such authority, Do hereby Proclaim and declare that I have assigned to the Southern District as originally defined by the aforesaid Proclamations of the eighteenth of January 1844, and the seventh of November 1845, SIDNEY STEPHEN, Esquire, a Judge of the Supreme Court.

This Proclamation shall take effect from and after the day of the date hereof.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Islands of New Zealand, at Government House, at Wellington, in the Islands aforesaid, this eleventh day of March, in the year of Our Lord One Thousand eight hundred and fifty-two.

During this Quarter, (1851) the sum of £1600 was paid into the Wellington Treasury, being the repayment of the balance of the loan of £2400 advanced to the Canterbury Association.

In the Quarter (1850) the Sub-Treasurer of Akaroa received a remittance in aid of Revenue of £140 from the Sub-Treasurer at Lyttelton.
