By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, a Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, the undermentioned Ordinances enacted by the Governor-in-Chief of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, were passed in the Twelfth and Fifteenth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria viz.—

No. 2 Session IX, 1848, "An Ordinance for Regulating the Conveyance and Postage of Letters," and

No. 1, Session XI. 1851, "An Ordinance to Provide for the Arrest of Debtors, Escaping from the Islands of New Zealand,"

which Ordinances having been by the Right Honorable Earl Grey, one of Her

Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, laid before the Queen, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

Now, THEREFORE, I, the Governor-in-Chief of New Zealand Do HEREBY PROCLAIM and make known to all whom it may concern, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the beforementioned Ordinances.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, a Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance passed by the Governor-in-Chief of the New Zealand Islands, by and with the consent of the Legislative Council thereof, intituled "An Ordinance for the Naturalization of certain Persons in the Islands of New Zealand," Session XI., No. 9, it is enacted, that all and singular the persons who shall be declared to come within the operation of such Ordinance by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, shall be deemed and taken, until the next Session of the General Legislature within the Islands of New Zealand, to be natural born subjects of Her Majesty.

Now therefore I, the Governor-in-Chief, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said in part recited Ordinance, do HEREBY Proclaim and declare, that the Persons whose names are under-written, shall be deemed and taken to be natural born subjects of Her Majesty from the date set opposite their names respectively, until the next Session of the General Legislature of the Islands of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if their names had been inserted in the Schedule annexed to the said Ordinance.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, a Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor & Commander-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, in a Proclamation bearing date the thirteenth day of May last, it was declared that the Ordinance for imposing a Tax upon Raupo Houses No. 17 of Session II., should come into operation within the Towns of Lyttelton and Christchurch, from and after the first day of November next:

Now, I, the Governor, DO HEREBY REVOKE, such part of the said Proclamation as is hereinbefore mentioned; and DO HEREBY PROCLAIM AND DECLARE, that the Raupo Ordinance aforesaid, shall come into force within the limits of the said Towns of Lyttelton and Christchurch, as the same are described and delineated in the last published Maps of the Canterbury Association, from and after the First day of February, 1853.

This Proclamation shall take effect from and after the date hereof.

## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, a Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor & Commander-in-Chief, in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, the undermentioned Ordinances enacted by the Lieutenant

Governor of the Province of New Munster, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, were passed in the Thirteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, viz. :—

No. 1, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to Naturalize certain persons in the Province of New Munster.”

No. 3, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to prevent Entire Horses and certain other Animals, from being suffered to stray or run at large.

No. 5, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to confer upon the Lieutenant-Governor of New Munster, within the Province, the same powers in certain cases as are conferred on the Officer Administering the Government of the Colony for the time being.”

No. 6, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to provide a cheap and expeditious mode of procedure against persons occupying Land or Premises within the Province of New Munster, without right, title, or license.”

No. 7, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to authorize the levying and collecting of Rates for the Making and Repairing of Roads, Streets, &c., &c., in any Town in the Province of New Munster.”

No. 8, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to appropriate the Revenue for the year 1849-1850.”

No. 9, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to increase the Efficiency of the Constabulary Force.”

No. 10, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to authorise the Levying and Collection of Tolls on Roads, and Rates on Land in the Province of New Munster,” and

No. 11, Session 1, 1849.—“ An Ordinance to abate the Dog Nuisance,” which Ordinances having been by the Right Honorable Earl Grey one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State laid before the Queen, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the same.

Now therefore, I, the Governor of the Province of New Munster, DO HEREBY Proclaim and make known to all whom it may concern that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the before mentioned Ordinances.

SIR,—I transmit for your information the Copy of a Letter addressed to my Department, by direction of Her Majesty's Commissioners for the Exhibition of 1851, expressing the sense entertained by the Commissioners of the important services rendered by many of Her Majesty's Colonies, and announcing their intention of presenting to each of the Colonies in which Local Committees were formed, a series of the several Medals distributed by them, together with a Copy of the Jury Reports, Illustrated with Photographs of Articles exhibited, and also a Copy of the Illustrated Catalogue, "as a Memorial of the Great Undertaking in which they have been engaged."

SIR,—I am directed by Her Majesty's Commissioners for the Exhibition of 1851, to request that you will communicate to Earl Grey their sense of the important services rendered to the Exhibition, which has recently been brought to a successful termination, by many of Her Majesty's Colonies, where the most praiseworthy exertions have been made to ensure a proper representation of their respective industries.

The Commissioners feel that the display of Colonial Productions which has been the result of those exertions has tended greatly to increase the interest

and success of the Exhibition; and they are the more sensible of their value, from their knowledge of the peculiar difficulties which in many instances had to be overcome, arising from the remoteness of the Colonies, the comparatively short time in which the collections had to be made, and other causes.

I am, therefore, directed to request that you will move Lord Grey to convey to the different Colonies represented at the Exhibition, this expression of the feelings entertained by Her Majesty's Commissioners.

It is their intention to present to each of the eleven Colonies named below, in which Local Committees were formed, and which were more especially so represented, a series of the several Medals distributed by them, together with a copy of the Jury Reports, illustrated with Photographs of Articles Exhibited, and also a Copy of the Illustrated Catalogue (as soon as they can be prepared,) as a Memorial of the Great Undertaking in which they have been engaged.
