PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE GREY, a Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and Governor of the Provinces of New Ulster and New Munster, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance passed by the Governor-in-Chief of the New Zealand Islands, by and with the consent of the Legislative Council thereof, intituled "*An Ordinance for the Naturalization of certain persons in the Islands of New Zealand*," Session XI, No. 9, it is enacted, that all and singular the persons who shall be declared to

come within the operation of such Ordinance, by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief, shall be deemed and taken, until the next Session of the General Legislature within the Islands of New Zealand, to be natural born subjects of Her Majesty.

Now therefore, I, the Governor-in-Chief, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said in part recited Ordinance, Do HEREBY Proclaim and Declare, that the person whose name is underwritten, shall be deemed and taken to be a natural born subject of Her Majesty from the date set opposite his name, until the next Session of the General Legislature of the Islands of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been

inserted in the Schedule annexed to the said Ordinance.

This Proclamation shall take effect from and after the date hereof.
