THE WAIPU NORTH HIGHWAY DISTRICT.

Bounded towards the North by the Southern boundaries of the Mangapai and Ruakaka blocks from the point of intersection of the South-Western

boundary of the former block by the Great North Road to Uretiti on the East Coast; towards the North-East by high water mark of the sea from Uretiti aforesaid to the North Head of the Waipu entrance; towards the South by the Waipu river and the Northern branch thereof called Pohuenui to the North-Western boundary of allotment No. 1 of the Parish of Waipu, thence by the North-Western and South-Western boundaries of said allotment No. 1 to the Ahuroa or Western branch of the Waipu river, thence by said Western branch river to the Southern boundary of allotment No. 196 of the Parish of Waipu aforesaid, thence by the Southern boundary of said allotment No. 196 to its South-Western angle, and by a right line thence bearing 253 degrees Westerly to the Eastern boundary of the Mareretu block, and towards the West by parts of the Eastern boundaries of the Mareretu and Ruarangi blocks to the intersection of the Eastern boundary of the last-named block by the Great North Road and continuing along the centre of the Great North Road aforesaid to the place of commencement.
