VICTORIA, by the grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Queen, Defender of the Faith, to WILLIAM WILSON TICKLE, of Dunedin, in the Province of Otago, New Zealand, merchant, trading under the firm of TICKLE AND COMPANY, greeting:

Whereas an action is now pending in our Supreme Court of New Zealand, Southern District, Province of Otago, between ALFRED CLEVE SALI CLEVE, and DANIEL HERMAN CLEVE, trading under the firm of CLEVE AND COMPANY, merchants, plaintiffs, and EDWARD STEELE, of Dunedin, aforesaid, builder, defendant, and in order that the plaintiffs may proceed in the said action:

We command you that you do retain and keep all and singular lands and other hereditaments, monies and chattels, bills, bonds, and other property of whatsoever
