### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

At the Provincial Government Buildings, Dunedin, this 19th day of February, 1875 ;

Present—His Honor the Superintendent ; Donald Reid, George Turnbull, and Robert Stout, Esquires.

WHEREAS by Proclamation bearing date the 3rd day of June, 1868, made by the Superintendent of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, and published in the Otago Provincial Gazette, No. 553, under the hand of the said Superintendent of the Province of Otago, and under the public seal of the said Province, certain regulations were made for the depasturing of stock upon the Waste Lands of the Crown within the Otago Gold Field : And whereas by Proclamation bearing date the 6th day of October, 1868, made by the Superintendent of the Province of Otago as aforesaid, and published in the Otago Provincial Government Gazette, No. 572, as aforesaid, the said regulations of the 23rd June, 1868, were altered and amended : And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of September, 1873, made by John Theodore Thomas Boyd, Esquire, Deputy Superintendent for the time being of the Province of Otago, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of the said Province, the said regulations were further altered and amended : And whereas it is expedient to further amend the said Regulations, in so far as they relate to the Wakatipu District :

Now, therefore, James Macandrew, Esquire, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, with the advice and

consent of the Executive Council of the said Province doth, by virtue and in exercise of the powers delegated to the Executive Government of the Province of Otago in that behalf, hereby revoke the Regulations 1 and 2 made under the said Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of September, 1873, by which regulations numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, of the said regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, were revoked, and regulations numbered 13 and 16 of the said regulations were amended so far as the same apply to the said Wakatipu District, and doth make the regulations following in lieu thereof, as regards the said Wakatipu District, (that is to say) of regulations numbered 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, of the said regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, and in lieu of regulations numbered 1 and 2 of the said regulations made under the said Order in Council bearing date the 10th day of September, 1873.

*Depasturing Regulations, Otago Gold Field, Wakatipu District.*

1. Mr. Robert M'Morran, Ranger in the said Wakatipu District, shall have all the powers, and exercise all the functions, held and exercised by the Board of Wardens for the said District.

2. Sections 13 and 16 of the said Regulations of the 23rd day of June, 1868, shall be read and construed as if the words " Mr. Robert M'Morran, Ranger in the Wakatipu District of the Otago Gold Field," had been originally inserted in the place of the words " Board of Wardens."

#### NOTICE

Of certain lands at Invercargill, in the Province of Otago, having been set apart as a Reserve for Collection and Supply of Water for the Town of Invercargill.

By His Honor James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago.

WHEREAS the Provincial Council of Otago have under and by virtue of Section 16 of the "Southland Waste Lands Act, 1865," recommended that the land hereinafter described should be reserved as a reserve for collection and supply of water for the town of Invercargill, and it is expedient that the said lands should be so reserved for that purpose: Now, therefore, I, James Macandrew, Superintendent of the Province of Otago, in pursuance and exercise of the power and authority vested in me in this behalf, do hereby publish and declare that I have made and dedicated the lands hereinafter described a reserve for the collection and supply of water for the town of Invercargill: (that is to say)—

One block 360 acres, being section 133 in the Forest Hill Hundred, situated near the head of the west branch of the Dunsdale Creek, and bounded towards the east by section 134 of said Hundred 3869½ links; towards the north-east by a line bearing 297deg. 20min., a distance of 7036 links; towards the north-west by a line at right angles to the north-east boundary, 4770 links; towards the south-west by a line parallel to the north-east boundary, 6212 links; and towards the south by a line running due east, 2922 links; and one block of 460 acres, being section 134 in the Forest Hill Hundred, bounded towards the south-east by section 52 of aforesaid Hundred, 3960 links; on the south by a line running due west, 269 links; towards the west by section 133 aforesaid, 3859½ links, and a line running due north, 8786½ links; towards the north by a line running due east, 4000 links; towards the east by a line running due south, 3752 links; again towards the south by a line running due west, 230 links; again towards the east by a public road, 1914 links; 1368 links, 1248 links, and 644 links: and a line running to the north-east corner of section 52 aforesaid, 2819½ links, always excepting out of the land described the reserved tract running through the said blocks.

#### PRIZES FOR LABOR-SAVING MACHINES.

NOTICE.—The Provincial Council of Otago being desirous of stimulating invention and securing the introduction of labor-saving appliances calculated to assist in developing the agricultural resources of the Province, has voted a sum of £150, with a view to enable a first and second prize to be offered for the most approved drainage ploughs—the first prize to be £100, the second prize £50,—the prizes to be awarded on such terms, and in such amounts, as the Government may consider advisable.

Notice is hereby given that in accordance with the vote of the Council, a competition of Draining Machines will be held during the month of August next, in a stiff

clay soil, in a locality to be hereafter selected, contiguous to Dunedin.

The following particulars are published for the information of intending competitors:—The judges to be appointed shall be composed of machinists and agriculturists; and in awarding the prizes the following points will be kept in view:—

1st. To secure a machine which will remove the soil and finish a drain to the depth of at least 42 inches, and which will leave the drain ready for the pipes with the least amount of manual labor.

2nd. Or, failing the above, a machine that will remove part of the soil, and loosen the remainder to a depth of say 36 to 42 inches, so that it could be quickly removed by manual labor.

Each machine to be capable of adjustment so as to cut different widths of drains, to suit main, sub-main, and ordinary drains, say 12 inches wide at bottom for main drains, and 2½ or 3 inches for small drains.

In determining the merits of the respective machines, the Judges will consider the quality of the work done, the price of the machine, and the cost of the drain, as completed in each case, and other things being equal, the preference will be given to the machine which removes the smallest quantity of earth compatible with the full attainment of the object desired, and which can be supplied at the lowest cost.

Should the judges consider that the machines exhibited do not merit the full amount of the premium, the prizes will be awarded only to such an extent, and in such amounts as they may recommend.

**T**HE following Rules and Regulations have been submitted to the Superintendent and his Executive Council, in terms of the Cemeteries Reserves Management Ordinance, 1864, and are published for general information.

RULES AND REGULATIONS  
OF THE  
OTEPOPO CEMETERY.

1. All charges must be paid when orders are given.
2. Any person or persons making a vault, or erecting and placing a monument in the Cemetery, by and with the permission of the Trustees, under these Rules, and upon the payment of the charges therein mentioned, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep up such vault, monument or tombstone, according to the terms of such permission, to and for the sole and separate use of such person or persons, heirs, relations, and friends for ever.
3. Application for such permission must be made to the Secretary, or one of the Trustees. A certificate of such permission, in the form set out in Schedule B., will be granted to the party applying for such permission, on payment of the charges in Schedule A.
4. The costs and charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in such Cemetery, on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence proving to the satisfaction of the Trustees that such person was a pauper, or that the relations and friends of the deceased were unable to pay the cost and charges.
5. Orders for interment must be given to the sexton at least six working hours prior to the hour fixed for the funeral, otherwise an extra charge will be made (See Schedule A). No free interment will be allowed without the above notice of six hours.
6. The Trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but parties wanting brick graves or vaults will be

required to construct them under the direction of a surveyor (appointed by the Trustees); and in case interment is to be made in any private grave or vault, the consent in writing of the party entitled thereto must be left with the order.

7. The name, age, the place of residence, and probable cause of death of the deceased, and other information, as per Schedule C, must be stated at the time of giving the order.

8. The time fixed for the funeral must be the time when the procession is to be at the Cemetery.

9. Until otherwise ordered, the usual hours fixed for funerals will be from 8 o'clock a.m. to 5 o'clock p.m., from the 1st day of September to the 30th day of April, and from 8 o'clock a.m. to 4 o'clock p.m. in the other four months of the year, except on Sundays, when the usual and only funerals will be from 2 to 5 o'clock p.m. throughout the year. No funerals will be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 o'clock p.m. and 7 o'clock a.m.

10. All monuments, vaults, graves, and grave stones must be kept in repair and proper condition by, and at the expense of, the owners.

11. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate or iron; and every coffin in a private grave, must have on the lid a metal plate with the name of the deceased stamped or painted thereon.

12. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every fence, monument, or tablet proposed to be erected, and a copy of every epitaph or inscription must be submitted to the Trustees for approval.

13. No servant, or any other person employed by, or engaged in any duty on behalf of, the Trustees, will be permitted to receive any gratuity for the discharge thereof.

14. The ground will be open daily to the public from sunrise to sunset.

15. A plan of the Cemetery, showing the situation of the graves, is kept by the Secretary, and may be inspected at the charge set out in Schedule A; and registers of all grants are kept by the Secretary.

16. The sexton has orders to turn out, or take into custody (as the case may require), any person who shall behave indecorously, or commit any trespass or injury to the trees, flowers, or erections, or otherwise infringe the Ordinance relating to the Cemetery, or the Regulations for the protection of the same; and such person shall be proceeded against according to the provisions of the "Cemetery Reserves Management Ordinance, 1864."

17. No funeral will be allowed to take place in the Cemetery without a certificate from a deputy Registrar, or Coroner holding an inquest or inquiry, or a magistrate: such certificate must be delivered to the sexton at the Cemetery before the funeral enters the gates.

18. All ordinary meetings of the Trustees shall be held on the third Monday of January, April, July, and October, at 8 o'clock p.m. Special meetings may at any time be called by the Secretary.

19. The Trustees reserve the right to make any alterations from time to time in these Charges and Regulations.
