PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Major-General,
GEORGE DEAN PITT,
*Knight of the Royal Hanoverian
Guelphic Order, Lieutenant-
Governor of the Province of
New Ulster, &c., &c., &c.*

WHEREAS, by an Ordinance enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, intituled—“An Ordinance for regulating the Slaughtering of Cattle in certain places,” Session 8, No. 5, it is—for the purpose of regulating the slaughtering of cattle in certain places—amongst other things enacted, “that it shall be lawful for his Excellency the Governor from time to time to constitute, and define certain districts for the purpose aforesaid;” And whereas it is thereby further enacted, “that within any such district, and after a day to be prescribed by any such Proclamation, no person shall keep a Slaughterhouse, or place for slaughtering cattle intended for sale, barter, shipping, or exportation, except such house or place be duly licensed, for that purpose,” and that “if any person shall slaughter or cause to be slaughtered any cattle as aforesaid, in any house, or place, within such district, he shall forfeit and pay the sum of Five Pounds for every head of Cattle so slaughtered;” And by the said Ordinance, it is enacted that the word “Cattle,” unless otherwise expressly stated, shall be taken to include Horned or Neat Cattle, Sheep, Goats, and Swine:

And, whereas it is expedient to prevent the slaughtering of cattle, within certain parts of the Town of Auckland.

Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor, do by this Proclamation, constitute and define so much of the Town of Auckland, as is included within the following boundaries, to be a district for the purposes of the said recited Ordinance, (that is to say)

“Hobson-street on the west; High-water mark, Custom-house-street, and high-water mark till it reaches the strand in Mechanics' Bay, on the north; the strand and Symonds' street on the east, including Section 9; and Wakefield and Wellesley-streets on the south.”

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare, that on and after the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, no such slaughter-house shall be kept, and no such cattle shall be slaughtered, within such district as aforesaid.

CAUTION.

HARBOURING DESERTERS.

Colonial Secretary's Office,
 Auckland, 24th August, 1848.

HIS Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has directed the following clause in the Mutiny Act, 10 Vict., c. 12, to be published for general information.

"And be it enacted, that if any Person who shall in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, by words, or by any other means whatsoever, directly or indirectly, procure any Soldier to desert, or shall by words, or by any other means whatsoever, attempt to procure or persuade any Soldier to desert, and any person, who knowing that any Soldier is about to desert, shall aid or assist him in deserting, or knowing any Soldier to be a Deserter, shall conceal such Deserter, or aid or assist such Deserter in concealing himself, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanour, and shall on conviction thereof, be liable to be punished by fine, or imprisonment, or both, as the Court before which such conviction shall take place may adjudge."

And the Lieutenant-Governor directs notice to be hereby given, that no Timber, occupation, or other license, will be renewed by the Government, in favour of any Person who shall be found aiding or assisting any Soldier so deserting, by harbouring, concealing, or employing him, or in any other manner howsoever.

RATIONS TO ROAD PARTIES.

*Colonial Secretary's Office,
Auckland, Sept. 8th, 1848.*

TENDERS will be received at this Office, until noon, on Wednesday, the 20th September, for the supply of rations on the undermentioned scale, for Natives employed on the public Roads, for the period commencing on 11th October, 1848, and ending 31st March, 1849.

The Daily ration for each man to consist of—
1lb Fresh Pork
1½lb Flour or Bread, and
12oz. Rice, or 2lb Potatoes.

The Flour or Bread to be of the best quality. The Rations must be delivered by the Contractor at such places as may be indicated by the Superintendent of Roads, before the hour of noon, on Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday in each week.

The number of Natives employed will vary from three to four hundred; and any additional information which may be required respecting terms of the Contract, &c., together with forms of Tender, may be obtained on application to the Superintendent of Roads, at the Office of the Surveyor General.

Security will be required for the due performance of the Contract, and the Tenders must be accompanied by a notification of consent of the parties proposed as Sureties.
