* The amount collected in 1847, was $\pounds 18,584$ 12s. 11d., from which has been deducted the sum of $\pounds 1$ 181 8s. 10d., being the amount refunded to the Commissariat on account of the exemption from Customs' dues of supplies imported for the troops.

† The refund to the Commissariat in 1848 was \pounds 1 677 3s. 1d., which has been deducted from the gross collection of that year. The sum of \pounds 21,713 9s. 4d., includes arrears of the years 1842 and 1843, amounting to \pounds 1,910 [1s. 1d:
