Otauhu, April 24, 1849.

Sir,

In pursuance of the Regulations published in the "Government Gazette," dated November 2, 1848, No. 26, concerning the depasturing cattle on the unoccupied Lands of the Crown,—we have the honor to transmit a copy of our Regulations, by which you will perceive that we think it equitable not only to take into consideration the amount of money paid into the Public Treasury, but also the value of all improvements which have been made on the lands in building, fencing, and cultivation.

We consider the Waste Lands of the Crown in this hundred capable of depasturing 400 head of great, and 1600 head of small cattle. The following list contains the name of each person holding a license in this hundred, with the number of cattle which he is entitled to run according to the above regulations, viz:—

RULES for depasturing Stock on the
Waste Lands within the Hundred of One-
hunga.

Southern Division.

1st.—

THAT all persons holding license for de-
pasturing within the hundred of Onehunga
shall be allowed to depasture on the bona fide
Waste Lands of the Crown within the said
hundred, all such horned or Great Cattle whe-
ther Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Steers or Heifers, and
all such Horses, Mules, and Asses, as to them
the said parties holding such license shall bona
fide belong to themselves respectively, and to
none other.

2nd.—That any person holding a license to
depasture Stock on the aforesaid lands, in the
aforesaid hundred, may and shall be allowed
to have any number of dairy Cows, to be by
him or them actually used for the purpose of
milking for dairy purposes, and none other.
And the said dairy Cattle shall be deemed and
taken to be the bona fide property of such per-
son so hiring and so using them for the time
being.

Southern Division—(Mungarie).

3rd.—That any persons holding license as
aforesaid, may depasture any number or kind
of Stock, great or small Cattle (being the bona
fide property of such licensed person), on the
bona fide Crown waste lands, Mungarie side.

4th.—That all highways running through
or within the hundred be considered as part of
the Crown Lands aforesaid.

That all such portions of road as run along
the boundary line be common to both hundreds.

That a right of pasturage be mutually enter-
tained to persons situate on the boundaries re-
spectively to a modulus distance on each side
of the boundary line.
