Sir,

In pursuance of the Regulations published in the "Government Gazette," dated November 2, 1848, No. 26, concerning the depasturing cattle on the unoccupied Lands of the Crown,—we have the honor to transmit a copy of our Regulations, by which you will perceive that we think it equitable not only to take into consideration the amount of money paid into the Public Treasury, but also the value of all improvements which have been made on the lands in building, fencing, and cultivation.

We consider the Waste Lands of the Crown in this hundred capable of depasturing 400 head of great, and 1600 head of small cattle. The following list contains the name of each person holding a license in this hundred, with the number of cattle which he is entitled to run according to the above regulations, viz :--

RULES for depasturing Store of the Change Messars. Connell & Ridings, Queen-st. Waste Lands within the Hundred of One- Mr. Hyan Joseph "

THAT all persons holding litense for depasturing within the hundred of Onehunga shall be allowed to depasture on the bona fide Waste Lands of the Crown within the said hundred, all such horned or Great Cattle whether Bulls, Cows, Oxen, Steers or Heifers, and all such Horses, Mules, and Asses, as to theor the said parties holding such license shall bona fibe belong to themselves respectively, and te none other.

none other. 2nd.—That any person holding a license to depasture Stork on the aforesaid lands, in the aforesaid hundred, may and shall be allowed to her only number of dairy Cows, to be by him or them actually used for the purpose of milking for dairy purposes, and none other. And the said dairy Cattle shall be deemed and taken to be the bend fide property of Such person so hiring and so using them for the time being:

Southern Division-(MUNGARDE).

aforesaid, may depasture any number or kind of Stock, great or small Cattle (being the bonâ fide property of such licensed person), or the boina fide Crown waste lands, Mungarie side.

"Ith." That all highways finning through or within the hundred be considered as part of the Crown Lands aforesaid.

That all such portions of road as run along the boundary line becommon to both hundreds. That a right of pastaining be mutually enter-

tained to persons situate on the boundaries very spectively to armodisum distance on each side of the boundary line.
