ON and after the 1st of November, 1849, the Pilot's communications from vessels approaching this Port, their names, or numbers, and any other intelligence conveyed by means of Marryat's Signals, will be repeated at the Signal Station on Mount Victoria.

The Flags which have hitherto been used to indicate the rig of vessels steering for the Port, and the signal of distress, will continue to be used; but the following communications will be made by means of the Flags of Marryat's Code:—

- No. 1. Blue Square on a White Ground—the vessel is from New South Wales
- No. 2. Blue, White, and Blue (horizontally)—from Van Diemen's Land
- No. 3. White and Red (perpendicularly)—from South Australia
- No. 4. White Cross on a Blue Ground—from Western Australia
- No. 5. Red (Swallow Tailed)—from Wellington
- No. 6. Blue, Yellow, and Red—from Middle Island

No. 1.—Wyndham Street	From the junction of Hobson and Wyndham Streets along the southern side of the last mentioned street to its junction with Queen Street.
2.—Queen Street	From the "Marlborough Arms," being the south-west angle of Lot 41, of Section 4, of the Town of Auckland, along the eastern side of Queen Street to its junction with Shortland Street, along the Southern Side of Shortland Street to High Street.
Shortland Street	
3.—Princes Street	Western side of Princes Street from Emily Place to Victoria Quadrant.
4.—Princes Street	Eastern side of Princes Street from Emily Place to Waterloo Quadrant.
5.—Victoria Quadrant	From the General's Guard House, along the southern side of Victoria Quadrant to a point opposite the north-east fence of the lot on which the Wesleyan Chapel and School stand.
6.—Waterloo Quadrant	From Princes Street along the northern side of Waterloo Quadrant to the bottom of the steps on the west side of Mechanics' Bay.
7.—Waterloo Quadrant, and Symonds Street	On the southern side of Waterloo Quadrant from the Guard House of the old Government House to Symonds Street, along the western side of that street to the Barrack wall.
8.—Rutland Road	From Windsor Terrace, Epsom Road, to St. George's Bay, on the south side of Rutland Road, 7 chains, 90 links; thence on the north side thereof, 8 chains, 10 links, and thence to St. George's Bay, 2 chains and 30 links.
9.—Epsom Road	On the east side of Road from the Bridge, Mechanics' Bay, to Road leading to Cooper's Bay, from thence on the west side to Hobson's Bridge. From Hobson's Bridge on the west side to opposite the road to Papakura.
