His Excellency the Governor-in-Chief has been pleased to grant the following Pensions for wounds received during the suppression of the rebellion at the Bay of Islands, according to the provisions of the "Pensions Ordinance," No. 3, Session 10.

To Daniel Munro . . . 1s. per diem.

" John Alexander . . . 1s. per diem.

" James Tapper . . . 1s. per diem.

to commence from the 1st December, 1849, and to continue in force for two years.

With reference to the foregoing Pensions His Excellency directs it to be notified that the following regulation, respecting Pensions to Soldiers, contained in the "Royal Warrant and Regulations regarding Army Services," will be made applicable as far as possible to Pensions granted according to the Ordinance above referred to. Page 212, art. 6th.

"The amount of Pension granted by the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital shall not exceed the rates fixed by this regulation. In special cases, however, of men whose disabilities shall have increased subsequently to their leaving the service, the Commissioners may reconsider such cases, if any peculiar circumstances justifying such a proceeding shall occur, and be brought forward within two years after the original grant of pension was made."

WITH reference to the notice of the 9th instant, from this office, publishing the names of Persons to whom Depasturing Licenses have been issued within the several Hundreds of Auckland, Onehunga, Panmure, Howick, Otahuhu, and Pupuke,—I hereby call Meetings, to be held in conformity with the provisions of the Crown Lands' Ordinance, (No. 1, Session 10); at the places and times specified below, of such holders of Depasturing Licenses, for the purpose of electing from among themselves three Wardens, within the said Hundreds respectively, who shall have the regulation and apportionment for the current year of the right of pasturage within the Hundred, as provided in the said Ordinance.

For the Hundred of Auckland, at the office of the Commissioner of Crown Lands, on Thursday, the 7th February, at 1 o'clock, P.M.

For the Hundred of Onehunga, at the Village on Wednesday, the 6th February, at one o'clock, P.M.

For the Hundred of Panmure, at the Village on Friday, the 8th February, at two P.M.

For the Hundred of Howick, at the Village on Saturday, the 9th February, at two P.M.

For the Hundred of Otahuhu, at the Village on Monday, the 11th February, at two P.M.

For the Hundred of Pupuke, at Mr. Mellivn's, near the Roman Catholic College, on Tuesday, the 12th February, at one P.M.

None but personal attendants at the meeting will be allowed to vote.

Every such voter will be entitled to one vote for each of the three Wardens, and is requested to bring his license with him, for production, if required.
