Auckland respectively, having been duly received by me from the Wardens of those Hundreds, are now, in conformity with the 30th clause of the Crown Lands' Ordinance, No. 1, Session 10, published for general information.

MEETING OF WARDENS OF THE PANMURE
HUNDRED.

Present :—

His Lordship the BISHOP of New Zealand,
JOHN GRAY, Esq., J.P., and
Mr. JAMES CLEARY.

Proposed by his Lordship, the Bishop of New Zealand, that Major Gray be requested to act as Secretary and Treasurer.

Read "Crown Lands' Ordinance," Session 10, No. 1.

Read lists of Holders of Depasturing Licenses within the Hundred of Panmure, and a Return of Land occupied by them under Crown Grant.

Read a Return of Crown Lands in the Hundred of Panmure, reported as amounting to 1697 acres, of which there are in the Western Division 1,367 acres, and in the Eastern Division 330 acres.

Compared the above lists and returns with those of last year. It appears that the number of Depasturing Licenses for the current year is 38, which are held by owners or occupiers of land,

under Crown Grant, or as Pensioners, amounting in the aggregate to 3,939 acres.

The following apportionment is made; five head of small cattle being considered equivalent to one head of great cattle.

The following Resolutions were passed:—

1st.—That each holder of a license be entitled to depasture two head of great cattle free of all charge or assessment, in consideration of the sum paid for his license.

2nd.—That the Wardens do provide Stamped Tickets, which are to be suspended from the necks of all cattle depastured by holders of licenses; the cost of which will be defrayed in the first instance from the public fund, a register of those tickets shall be kept by the Wardens.

3rd.—That each holder of a license shall be at liberty to take out tickets for any number of cattle, not exceeding that apportioned to him, which number will be subject to such rate of assessment as the Wardens may find it necessary to impose under the Ordinance, and for duly carrying out its provisions.

4th.—That the Wardens will be ready to receive applications from holders of licenses for the depasturing of a larger number of cattle than that apportioned, whenever the state of the run shall be found to admit of it; all cattle so admitted being liable to the general assessment.

5th.—That a Pound be immediately erected near the spring of water in the scoria adjoining the Village of Panmure, and that Mr. James Cleary be recommended for the appointment of Poundkeeper.

That Mr. James Hamlin be requested to undertake the office of Ranger, receiving such remuneration as may be decided on by the Wardens.

March 4th, 1850.

Having read the Crown Lands' Ordinance, Session 10, and the other documents laid before the Wardens by the Commissioner,

Resolved—

That five head of Sheep be considered equivalent to one head of Great Cattle, that Pigs and Goats be wholly excluded.

The return of Crown Land for the Hundred being 2968 acres is considered calculated to carry 400 head Great Cattle, or 2000 sheep.

That all monies received under the Provisions of the Ordinance be paid forthwith into the Union Bank of Australia, Auckland, to the credit of the Wardens, and no sums withdrawn except upon the signature of two of the Wardens at least.

The Wardens hereby intimate that under the Bye Laws, shortly to be published, all cattle will be required to be branded and numbered under certain Penalties.

A Ranger will be appointed to carry out the provisions of the Ordinance.
