Excellency the Governor-in-Chief directs it to be notified that two grants of land, containing the same description of boundaries, having been issued, 4th January, 1845, and 3rd July, 1847, to Trans. Mil. LON and J. SKELTON, under Land Claim No. 169, for 1,766 and 794 acres respectively, and these grants having conferred the right of selection from the whole extent within the said boundaries to each grantee, and such right of selection having been duly notified and forwarded with the necessary documents to the Surveyor-General, in regard to the grant dated 22nd October, 1844, for 794 acres, in accordance with the provisions of the "Crown Titles Ordinance," Session 10, No. 4, and the said claim having been heard by Mr. Commissioner GISBORNE, on the 12th June, 1850, he reported that he considered it just and reasonable that the Assigns of Messis. Millon and Skelton, viz., William GREENWOOD and GEORGE PATTEN, should receive grants of the particular pieces of land claimed by them respectively, as set forth in the plan deposited in the office of the Surveyor-General,

Commissioner of Crown Lands' Office, Auckland, August 16th, 1850. HE attention of persons depasturing cattle upon Crown Lands outside the boundaries

SPECIAL MEETING of the Justices of of Proclaimed Hundreds, is called to the following clause of the Crown Lands Ordinance, (Sess. 10, No. 1,) which requires that returns of all Cattle so depastured shall be deposited with the Commissioner of Crown Lands during the ensuing month.

These returns to be according to the form

contained in the annexed Schedule.

Recurs of Stock to be made by Owner. "12. Any person depastoring cattle on any Waste Lands of the Crown not being within the limits of a Hundred, shall make or cause to be made to and deposited with a Commismissioner of Crown Lands, in the month of September in every year, commencing in September, 1849, a return according to the form contained in the schedule hereunto annexed, marked A, of all such cattle in his possession on the first day of the same month of September. And if any such person shall fail to make or cause to be made such return at the time so appointed, or shall omit to deposit the same with a Commissioner, in manner hereby required, he shall forfelt and pay for every such offence, any sum not less than twenty shillings, nor more than twenty pounds, to be recovered in a summary way. And if any person shall knowingly make any false statements in any such return he shall forfeit and pay for every, such offence any sum not less than fifty pounds, nor more than one hundred pounds, to he recovered by action in the Suprama Court, at the of missioner as aforesaid.
