GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

HIS Excellency the LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR directs it to be notified for general information, that he has assigned to the Resident Magistrates at Auckland, Bay of Islands, Monganui, and New Plymouth respectively, the following districts for the purpose of taking the Census of the Province, according to the provisions of the Census Ordinance, 15 Victoria, Session XI., No. 8.

AUCKLAND DISTRICT.

Bounded on the South by a line drawn from the South Head of Kawhia to the South Head of Tauranga, on the North by a line from Manaho Point to the junction of the Wairoa and Kai-hau Rivers, thence to the mouth of the Wairarua River, on the West and East by the Sea, including all the Islands adjacent thereto.

BAY OF ISLANDS.

Bounded on the North West by a line from Point Pocock to the South Head of False Hokianga, on the South by the North Boundary of the Auckland District, on the East and West by the Sea, including all the Islands adjacent thereto.

MONGANUI DISTRICT.

All the remaining part of the Island North of the Bay of Islands District.

TARANAKI DISTRICT.

Within a radius of twenty miles from the centre of the Town.
