PROCLAMATION.

By HIS EXCELLENCY CAPTAIN WILLIAM HOBSON, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies:

WHEREAS Her Majesty has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the Sixteenth day of November, in the Year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty, to erect the Islands of New Zealand into a separate territory, by the name of Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand:—Now, therefore, I, the Governor and Commander-in-Chief, by Commission under the Great Seal appointed, do hereby Notify and Proclaim that

under Her Majesty's said Letters Patent the Islands of New Zealand are henceforth to be designated and known as Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies. And I do hereby further Notify and Proclaim, that Her Majesty has been pleased to direct that the Three Principal Islands of New Zealand, heretofore known or commonly called—"The Northern Island," "The Middle Island," and "Stewart's Island," shall henceforward be designated and known respectively as "New Ulster," "New Munster," and "New Leinster," of which all Her Majesty's subjects are hereby required to take Notice.

Given under my Hand and Seal, at Government House, Auckland, this third day of May, in the fourth year of Her Majesty's Reign, and in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty-one.

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

PROCLAMATION.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY CAPTAIN HOBSON,
Governor and Commander-in-
Chief in and over the Colony of
New Zealand and its Dependenc-
cies, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Her Majesty has been gra-
ciously pleased, by Commission under
the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great
Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 16th day of
November, in the Year of our Lord, 1840, to con-
stitute and appoint me, **WILLIAM HOBSON**,
ESQUIRE, Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy,
to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and
over Her Majesty's Colony of New-Zealand and
its Dependencies.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor and Com-
mander-in-Chief, aforesaid, do hereby proclaim
and declare, that I have this day taken the pre-
scribed Oaths, and assumed the Administration of
the Government accordingly.

And I do hereby further proclaim and declare,
that Her Majesty has been pleased to appoint an
EXECUTIVE COUNCIL for the said Colony, and to
nominate and appoint the under-mentioned Per-
sons to be Members thereof,—That is to say:—

The Colonial Secretary of the said Colony for the
time-being,

The Attorney-General of the said Colony for the
time-being, and

The Colonial Treasurer of the said Colony for the
time-being.

And I do hereby proclaim and declare, that
Her Majesty has been further pleased to appoint
a LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL for the said Colony of
New Zealand and its Dependencies, and to ap-
point and direct that such Legislative Council
shall be formed and shall consist of the following
Members:—

His Excellency the Governor for the time-being,

The Colonial Secretary for the time-being,

The Attorney-General for the time-being,

The Colonial Treasurer for the time-being, and

The Three Senior Justices of the Peace, nomi-
nated as such in any Commission of the Peace
to be issued by me, the said Governor and
Commander-in-Chief, or by the Governor or
Acting-Governor for the time-being.

The Governor, fully impressed with the mag-
nitude and importance of the duties thus con-
fided to him, is supported by the hope that Al-
mighty God will bless his best efforts to give full
effect to these Her Majesty's most gracious measures
for the establishment of peace and order in this
important Colony; and he relies with confidence
on the loyalty of the Colonists, and on their
hearty co-operation with the Government in cul-
tivating those feelings of mutual good will, which
alone can insure to them the future benefit of
Her Majesty's solicitude for their welfare and
prosperity.

The Governor avails himself of this occasion
to appeal to the good feelings of the Colonists
generally in favor of their fellow subjects of the
Native Race, who require only instruction and
good example to become equal to Europeans in
mora, as they already are in physical attainments,
and to point out to all who really have the
true interests of the Country at heart, the prop-
riety of conciliating their affections by making
every charitable allowance for their defects, and
by conducting all intercourse with them in a spirit
of justice and forbearance.

The Governor trusts that he will be afforded
the satisfaction of hereafter knowing, that his
endeavours for the accomplishment of Her
Majesty's gracious and benign views have not
been employed in-vain.

Government-House, Auckland, this
3rd day of May, in the Fourth Year of
Her Majesty's Reign, and in the Year
of Our Lord One Thousand Eight
Hundred and Forty-one.

GOVERNMENT ORDER.

ON the occasion of Her Majesty's gracious will and pleasure being published to the Colonists that the Islands of New Zealand should be erected into a separate and independent Colony, His EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR deems it consonant with the humane principles which ever actuate Her Majesty in the exercise of Her Royal Prerogative, to extend to those persons who may be confined in the Prisons of New Zealand under summary conviction by the Magistrates, Her Majesty's Most Gracious Pardon; provided only that their crimes do not exhibit any peculiar degree of moral turpitude.

The Police Magistrates of the various Districts are therefore hereby required immediately to furnish to this Office the names of such Persons as may be so confined in their respective Districts, together with such remarks on each particular case as they may judge fit for His Excellency's information and guidance.
