HEREAS by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the High Court of Admiralty of England, bearing date the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain, constitute, and depute me, William Hobson, Esquire, Captain in her Majesty's Royal Navy, her Majesty's Vice Admiral, Commissary, and Deputy in the Office of Vice Admiralty in her Colony of New Zealand and the Territories thereon depending.

Now I, the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New Zealand aforesaid, do proclaim and declare this her Majesty's pleasure, and that I have this day assumed the powers and authority vested in me thereby.

Given under my Hand and Seal, this twenty-seventh day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty-one.
