PROCLAMATION.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY WILLIAM HOBSON, ESQUIRE, Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, and Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Her Majesjesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c.

HEREAS, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the High Court of Admiralty of England, bearing date the thirteenth day of March, 1841, Her Majesty has been gra-ciously pleased to ordain, constitute, and depute me, WILLIAM HOBSON, ESQUIRE, Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, to be Her Majesty's Vice-Admiral, Commissary, and Deputy in the office of Vice-Admiralty in Her Colony of New Zealand, and to the Territories thereon depending; to take cognizance of, and proceed in all causes, civil and maritime, and in complaints, contracts, offences, or suspected offences, crimes, and misdemeanors or,

Jurisdictiction of the Vice-Admiralty of the said Colony of New Zealand. To hear and determine the same according to the rights, statutes, laws, ordinanances, and customs anciently observed, with power of deputing and surrogating in my place for the premises one or more Deputy or Deputies, under me, for the said office and exe-cution thereof."

Now, I, the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New Zealand aforesaid, in pursuance of the above authority, do hereby appoint WILLIAM MARTIN, ESQUIRE, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of this Colony, my Deputy, with full power to take cognizance of, and proceed in all the matters, and to hear and determine the same in manner aforesaid.
