PROCLAMATION.

BY HIS EXCELLENCY WILLIAM HOBSON,
ESQUIRE, Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, and Governor and Commander in Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c.

WHEREAS, by Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the High Court of Admiralty of England, bearing date the thirteenth day of March, 1841, Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to ordain, constitute, and depute me, WILLIAM HOBSON, ESQUIRE, Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, to be Her Majesty's Vice-Admiral, Commissary, and Deputy in the office of Vice-Admiralty in Her Colony of New Zealand, and to the Territories thereon depending; to take

cognizance of, and proceed in all causes, civil and maritime, and in complaints, contracts, offences, or suspected offences, crimes, and misdemeanors or suspected misdemeanors, within the Maritime Jurisdiction of the Vice-Admiralty of the said Colony of New Zealand. To hear and determine the same according to the rights, statutes, laws, ordinances, and customs anciently observed, with power of deputing and surrogating in my place for the premises one or more Deputy or Deputies, under me, for the said office and execution thereof."

Now, I, the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of New Zealand aforesaid, in pursuance of the above authority, do hereby appoint WILLIAM MARTIN, ESQUIRE, Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of this Colony, my Deputy, with full power to take cognizance of, and proceed in all the matters, and to hear and determine the same in manner aforesaid.

CONDITIONS.

All the articles required by this Notice are to be of the best quality of their several kinds.

Vegetables to be supplied in reasonable proportions of potatoes, greens, pumpkins, onions, &c. &c.

The supplies to be delivered on the requisition of the Head of the Department for which they are authorized.

The Supplies (not specified in the preceding paragraph) are to be delivered direct to the parties or Establishments entitled thereto, on the written order of the person duly authorized for the purpose.

In the event of a difference of opinion between the Contractor and the party receiving the supplies, as to the quality, the same is to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a Board of Survey, according to the practice of the service.

If the Board shall decide that the article is not of a proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the Contractor, failing of which it will be procured by the Department requiring it, and the expense charged to the Contractor.

In the event of any unnecessary delay or failure of the Contractor to supply the articles when required, they will be otherwise procured in like manner.

In cases where the article is of a perishable nature, or from some other cause, injury would be sustained either by the parties to whom the Rations are due, or to the Contractor, by waiting for a Board of Survey, the head of the department shall have power to reject such article or articles as are obviously of inferior quality; it being distinctly understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and that the Con-

tractor will have a right to appeal to the Governor, although, in the mean time, he must take back the rejected article and supply good in its stead.

A repetition of irregularity in the quality or quantity of the supplies, or of any delay in delivering or replacing them when required, will subject the Contractor, upon the report of the officer in charge of the parties or establishment, to such mulct, not exceeding one fourth the amount of his monthly account, as the Governor may direct. It will also be in the power of the Governor, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract.

It will be in the power of either party to limit the duration of the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to the opposite party, and to end the contract at the expiration of that period.

The Contractor will be required to prepare his own account, monthly or quarterly, in the prescribed form; and on the production thereof, with the requisite vouchers, in a complete state, to the officer receiving the supplies, the same will be forwarded by the latter to the Treasurer, in order that a warrant may be prepared, and payment made from the Colonial Treasury.

The value of all packages to be included in the prices demanded.

Forms of Tender may be obtained at this Office; and as adequate security will be required for the due fulfilment of the Contract, no Tender can be attended to unless accompanied by a certificate from the parties proposed as such, stating that they are willing to become bound as securities for the Contractor accordingly, and the bonds must be executed within ten days from the day of acceptance of the Tender being notified, failing of which the contracts will be again advertised, or another Tender accepted.

The Tenders to contain the names of the Tenderers and their Sureties, and places of residence, at length.

All Tenders to be enclosed in a separate envelope, and marked "Tender for Provisions, &c."

The Parties tendering, or an Agent for them, are requested to attend at this Office, at the time appointed for receiving the Tenders.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

*Harbour Master's Office,

Commanders of Vessels steering to or from the

Port of Auckland, should be careful to avoid the undermentioned dangers:—

A Rock off the North side of the Island of Waiheke, distant about four miles, even with the water's edge at high water, with deep water extending to a short distance around it, from which the following Bearings and Land Marks were taken:—

North-eastern end of Waiheke, due East (mag.)

Bird Island, E. by N. $\frac{1}{4}$ N.

Northern end of Huva Kia, W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S.

Peak of Rangitoto, S. W. $\frac{3}{4}$ W.

2. A Rock situate to the Eastward of the Island of Tiri Tiri Mantangi, distant about one and a half miles, having two feet of water on it at low water, and fifteen fathoms close to on every side, from which the following Bearings and Land Marks were taken:—
