#### **PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency WILLIAM HOBSON,
Esquire, Captain in Her Majesty's Royal
Navy, and Governor and Commander in Chief
in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New
Zeeland and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

HEREAS by the Supreme Court Ordinance, Session 2. No. 1. it is enacted, that there shall be holden Circuit Courts for the despatch of the civil and criminal business of the Supreme Court, before one of the Judges thereof, at such places, and at such times as His Excellency the Governor shall, with the advice of the Executive Council, by proclamation from time to time appoint, provided that such Courts shall be holden twice in every year, at each of the places so to be appointed.

Now I, the Governor and Commander in-chief of the colory of New Zealand aforesaid, do hereby, with the advice of the said Executive Council, proclaim and appoint that such Circuit Court as aforesaid, shall be holden in the town of Wellington on the first day of October, in the present year, or as soon after the said day as conveniently may be, and that such Circuit Courts as aforesaid, shall be thereafter holden on the first day of April, and the first day of October in every year, or as soon after the said days respectively, as conveniently may be.
