ONE POUND REWARD.

THE individual named and described below, having been charged with an aggravated assault, on the person of a native woman, named Rangi, of Matakana, His Excellency the GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct the above reward to be given to any person who shall give such information at the Police Office, as shall lead to the apprehension of the offender.

Description of John Harper, charged with having assaulted Rangi, a native woman, residing at Matakana, in the beginning of July, 1842.

Harper is a very tall man, stands and walks remarkably upright, of swarthy complexion, dark eyes, very dark strong whiskers, has three marks similar to pock-marks upon his nose, and an impediment in his speech. He came in the *Nimrod* from Sydney some months ago, and represented himself to be a native Australian, but is suspected to be a runaway from Sydney.
