I have to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch of the 3rd of August last, No. 18, transmitting an Address from the Inhabitants of Auckland on the Birth of a Princess Royal.

IIS Excellency the Governor directs it to be notified, that Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to confirm and allow the following Ordinances passed by the Legislative Council of this Colony:

SESSION I, No. 2.

"An Ordinance to repeal within the Colony of New Zealand a certain Act of the Governor and Legislative Council of New South Wales, made and passed in the 4th year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, and adopted under an Ordinance of the Governor and Legislative Council of New Zealand for extending the Laws of New South Wales to the said Colony of New Zealand, and which said Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales is entituled "An Act to empower the Governor of New South Wales to appoint Commissioners with certain powers to examine and report on claims to Grants of Land in New Zealand, and also to terminate any commission issued under the same, and to authorize the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand to appoint Commissioners with certain powers to examine and report on Claims to Grants of Land therein, and to declare all other Titles excepting those allowed by the Crown null and void."

SESSION I, No. 4.

"An Ordinance for instituting and regulating Courts of General and Quarter Sessions in the Colony of New Zealand, and to authorize the holding of Petty Sessions within the same, and for defining their respective powers, and determining the places at which the same shall be holden, and for repealing within the Colony of New Zealand certain Acts of the Governor and Council of New South Wales, adopted and now in force within the said Colony of New Zealand."

SESSION I, No. 5.

"An Ordinance for prohibiting the Distillation of Spirits within the Colony of New Zealand."

"Until you shall have received further instructions on this subject, you will be authorized to continue Sales by Auction, fixing the minimum price of Land for ordinary lots at not lower than twenty shillings per acre, and for Suburban and Town Lots at such a price as you may think expedient."

"The Lords Commissioners of the Treasury have assented to my recommendation, for the appropriation to the purposes of Emigration to New Zealand, of the sum £12,000 from the amount reported by you to have been realized by the Land Sales at Auckland; and have further intimated their readiness to authorize an advance of £6,000 from the Commissariat Chest Fund, to defray the moiety of the expense of the Emigration under the Commissioners, which will be chargeable in this country."
