PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency WILLOUGHBY SHORTLAND, Esq., Colonial Secretary of Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, the Officer Administering the Government of the same.

WHEREAS, by Her Majesty's Royal "Charter for erecting the Colony of New Zealand, and for creating and establishing a Legislative Council and an Executive Council, and for granting certain powers and authorities to the Governor, for the time being, of the said Colony," bearing date the 16th day of November, 1840: it is provided, That in the event of the death, or absence out of the said Colony

of New Zealand, of such person as may be appointed to be Governor thereof, all and every the powers and authorities therein granted to the Governor of New Zealand, shall be vested in the Lieutenant Governor of the said Colony; or in the event of there being no Lieutenant Governor, the said powers and authorities are, by the said Charter, granted to the Colonial Secretary, for the time being, of the said Colony; and it is provided, that such Colonial Secretary shall have all such powers and authorities until Her Majesty's further pleasure shall be signified therein.

And whereas, His Excellency Captain Hobson, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the said Colony, hath this day departed this life. Now, therefore, I, the Colonial Secretary of New Zealand, do hereby proclaim and declare, that I have this day assumed all such powers and authorities as are granted to the Governor of New Zealand by the said Charter, and I hereby call upon all persons to be aiding and assisting me in the exercise thereof.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **WILLOUGHBY SHORTLAND**, Esq., the Officer administering the Government of Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by letters patent, under the Great Seal of the High Court of Admiralty of England, bearing date the thirteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, Her Majesty was graciously pleased, to ordain, constitute, and depute **WILLIAM HOBSON**, Esq., Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, and in the event of his absence, the Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, for the time being Her Majesty's Vice Admiral, Commissary, and Deputy in the Office of Vice Admiralty in her Colony of New Zealand, and the Territories thereon depending.

Now, **J. WILLOUGHBY SHORTLAND**, Esq., the Officer administering the Government of the Colony of New Zealand aforesaid, do proclaim and declare this Her Majesty's pleasure, and that I have this day assumed the powers and authority vested in me thereby.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **WILLOUGHBY SHORTLAND**, Esq., the Officer administering the Government of Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance enacted by the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, Session 2, No. 2, entitled "An Ordinance for establishing County Courts of Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction, and for repealing an Ordinance for instituting Courts of Requests, Session 1, No. 6, and for repealing part of an Ordinance for establishing Courts of Quarter Sessions, Session 1, No. 4." It is enacted that His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, shall from time to time appoint a place or places, within each County or District, as the

case may be, whereat County Courts of Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction shall be holden. Now, I, the Officer administering the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby direct and appoint, that for the purposes of the said in part recited Ordinance, the Islands of "New Munster" and "New Leinster," with the Islands adjacent, shall form a District, to be called the District of Nelson. And I do hereby, with the like advice, direct and appoint that a County Court of Civil and Criminal Jurisdiction shall be holden monthly at Nelson, in the said District of Nelson. And that the first sitting of the said Court, shall be holden on the third Tuesday in the month of January, 1843.
