PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency WILLOUGHBY SHORTLAND, Esquire, the Officer Administering the Government in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and its Dependencies, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c. &c. &c. Issued under the Public Seal of the Colony.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance, enacted by the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Session I, No. 2., reciting, that Her Majesty had been pleased to declare her gracious intention to recognize Claims to Land which may have been obtained on equitable terms, from the Chiefs, or other individuals of the Aboriginal Tribes inhabiting New Zealand, the Governor of New Zealand is empowered to appoint Commissioners to hear and examine, and report upon such claims. And whereas it is enacted by the said Ordinance, that the Commissioners so to be appointed shall, in examining such claims, inquire into and set forth the consideration paid for Land so claimed, and the date and other circumstances attending the purchase thereof; and that on being satisfied, that the person making such Claim is entitled to any Grant of Land, according to the said declaration of Her Gracious Majesty, the said commissioners shall report the same, and the

grounds thereof to the said Governor accordingly.

And whereas, by an Ordinance enacted by the Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council, Session II, No. 14, it is enacted, That whenever it shall be so reported that any person is entitled to a Grant of Land in respect of his alleged purchase, such person shall, on the Report being confirmed by His Excellency the Governor, be entitled to a Grant from the Crown.

And whereas, the Commissioners appointed to investigate Claims to Land have reported that the following persons have made purchases of Land, and that such persons are entitled to a Grant of Land in respect thereof.

NOW THEREFORE, I, the Officer Administering the Government, do hereby proclaim and declare that I have confirmed the Reports of the Commissioners, in the following cases, in which Grants of Land are recommended to be made.

Given under my hand, at Government House, Auckland, this fifteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-three.

HIS Excellency the Officer administering the Government directs it to be notified that the following claim to land in this Colony has been referred to the Commissioners appointed under the Ordinance of the Governor and Council of New Zealand, 5th Victoria, Session 2, No. 1, in addition to the claims notified in the *Government Gazette* of New South Wales, as referred to the Commissioners appointed under the Act of the Governor and Council of that Colony, on the 9th November, 1840, and on the 9th, 16th, 23rd, and 30th March, and the 6th, 18th, 20th, and 27th April; and in the *Government Gazette* of this Colony, on the 18th August, and 19th, 20th, and 27th October, 20th November, and 1st, 15th, and 22nd December, 1841; and 5th January, 28th March, 11th, 14th, and 18th May, 22nd June, 28th September, 12th October, 9th November, and 7th December, 1842.

Parties are reminded that, before such Claims can be investigated, they must pay to the Commissioner a Fee of Five Pounds, as prescribed by the Ordinance.

600, Six hundred acres, more or less, situate on the southern side of the Harbour of Kawhia; known by the names of Puketutu, Hamakuku, Kaipatu, Witianga, Puketoa, Kapeana, Mangareporepa, Takapau, Pairoa, Waiokaka, Paimamaku, Te Tetatea, Ngataumutu, and other names; bounded on the west by a creek or branch of the Waiharakeke river, called Oteke; on the south by a ridge called Kahakaharoa, on the east by a line running from Kahakaharoa to Taumamuka, to Mahaki, to Mangareporepo, to Pukerewarewa, and to Te Bata, and on the north by a line running from the Rata along a ridge to Pairoa, to Wakotuku, and to the creek Oteke.

Alleged to have been purchased by claimant from the native chiefs Haupokia, Ahuriri, Te Kahapu, Kaipaka, Tangi, Wakaugaro, Ngarinipi, Te Amangi, Manahorhi, Ngamotu, and others.

Consideration given to the natives—£100 in cash and merchandize.

Nature of conveyance.—Four deeds in favor of claimant.
