#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency ROBERT FITZROY, Esquire, Captain in Her Majesty's Royal Navy, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of New Zealand, and Vice Admiral of the same, &c.,&c.,&c.

HEREAS certain disaffected Natives in the Northern District of the Colony have taken up Arms, and are now in Rebellion against the Queen's Sovereign Authority, and for the suppression of such Rebellion active Military operations are about to be immediately undertaken by Her Majesty's Forces. Now I, THE GOVERNOR, do hereby proclaim and declare, that MARTIAL LAW will be exercised throughout that part of the said District which lies around the Bay of Islands, (including the said Bay), and within a circle of sixty miles in any direction from Russell, in the Bay of Islands—from this twenty-sixth day of April, 1845, until the said District shall be relieved from the jurisdiction of Martial Law by public Proclamation.

#### PROCLAMATION.

THE GOVERNOR, do hereby proclaim and declare that as soon as the Authority of the Queen is re-established at Russell—in the Bay of Islands—all rights of property, and claims to Land, will be fully recognised, and respected, as heretofore:—excepting those of persons who have acted hostilely against Her Majesty's Government, or any British Subject.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency ROBERT FITZROY,

of New Zealand and its Dependencies,
and Vice Admiral of the same, &c.,
&c., &c.

A LL Natives of the Bay of Islands, or its neighborhood, who are desirous of peace, commerce, and friendship with Europeans;—and the maintenance of the Queen's just authority;—while benefitting by the Mejerty's protection—are hereby called on and required to separate themselves in a few days from the ill disposed Natives—and to gather round their own Chiefs—under the British Flag—either at their own places:—or round the Massion Stations,—which will be secure places of

During the continuance of War—no Natives may approach the Ships—or Soldiers—or encampment at the Bay of Islands—wherever placed—without having a Missionary—or a Protector—with a white flag—with them—last the Soldiers should mistake friends for enemies—and fire upon them Islands.

All Boats, and other property, taken and from Kororareka by plundarers must be forthwith given up to persons duly authorised to receive the same.
