THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR directs attention to be called to the fact, that the Proclamation issued by His Excellency's predecessor, upon the 10th day of October, 1844, regarding the terms upon which Governor Fitz-Ray intended to waive the Crown's right of pre-emption in favor of certain individuals, has been in no way acted upon by the Lieutenant-Governor.

His Excellency further directs it to be notified, that be will not entertain or grant any application for waiving the Crown's right of pre-emption in favor of any individual, under the terms of the aforesaid proclamation, issued by his predecessor. He will, however, not fail to endeavour to devise and introduce some system by which Lands the property of the Natives may be brought into the market, under such restrictions as are required by the interests of both races.
