PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency **GEORGE GREY**,
Esquire, Lieutenant-Governor and
Commander-in-Chief, in and over
Her Majesty's Colony of New
Zealand, and its Dependencies,
and Vice Admiral of the same,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS an Ordinance was enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Session 3, No. 3, intituled—"An Ordinance to prohibit the Sale, &c., of Spirits, and to regulate the Sale, &c., of other Intoxicating Liquors to persons of the Native Race."

And Whereas by the said recited Ordinance it is enacted that the said Ordinance shall come into operation in such districts and at such times, as the Governor for the time being, shall by Proclamation from time to time appoint.

Now I, the Lieutenant-Governor do hereby appoint that the said recited Ordinance shall

come into operation in the Province of New Ulster, upon and from the 1st day of January, next. And in the Province of New Munster, upon and from such day as shall be named in a Proclamation to be for that purpose issued by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Province of New Munster.

Given under my hand, and issued under the public seal of the Colony, at Government House, Auckland, this eighth day of December, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven.
