WHEREAS, by the Royal Commission, bearing date the 13th day of September, 1852, addressed to Sir GEORGE GREY, Knight Commander of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, and constituting and appointing the said Sir GEORGE GREY, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, and reciting that it was expedient that an Executive Council should be appointed to advise and assist the Governor and Commander-in-Chief in the administration of the government of the said Islands, Her Majesty did authorize the said Governor and Commander-in-Chief to summon as an Executive Council such persons as might from time to time be named or designated by Her Majesty in any instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet addressed to him in that behalf. And whereas, by instructions under the Royal Sign Manual and Signet, bearing date the 13th day of September, 1852, and addressed to the Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, Her Majesty did nominate and appoint the undermentioned persons to be the Members of the said Executive Council, that is to say, the senior Military Officer for the time being in command of Her Majesty's Land Forces in the said Islands-the Colonial Secretary of and for the said Islands, or the person for the time being lawfully acting in that capacitythe Attorney-General of and for the said Islands, acting in that capacity-the Trea-surer of and for the said Islands, or the person for the time being lawfully acting in that capacity, and such other persons as the said Governor should deem to be qualified and capable to advise him. Now therefore, His Excellency the Officer administering the Government directs it to be notified that the undermentioned Officers have this day taken and subscribed the proper Oaths as Members of the said Executive Council.
