## PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel ROBERT HENRY WYNYARD, Companion of the most Honourable Order of the Bath, Officer Administering the Government and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Islands of New Zealand, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Public Reserves Act 1854," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any land shall have been set apart by the Government of New Zealand as a Public Reserve, and shall by Proclamation to be published in the New Zealand Government Gazette have been declared to have been so set apart as a Reserve made for the General Government, such land shall not thereafter be alienated by way of sale, mortgage, lease, or otherwise. Now, I, the Officer administering the Government of New Zealand do hereby proclaim and declare that the allotment or parcel of land hereinafter particularly described hath been set apart by me as a Reserve for the General Government as and for the site of a public Post Office, viz., part of allotment number one of section number seven of the City of Auckland, in the parish of Waitemata, in the county of Eden, bounded on the north by Emily place one hundred and thirty-two feet, on the east by allotment number sixteen of same section ninety-four feet four inches, on the south by allotment number two of same section seventy-nine feet three inches, on the west by part of allotment number one of same

section, occupied by the Colonial Secretary and Colonial Treasurer's offices seventy-two feet, again on the south by part of allotment number one of same section fifty-two feet nine inches, and again on the west by Princes street twenty-three feet nine inches.

Given under my hand and issued under the public Seal of the Islands of New Zealand, at Auckland, in the Islands aforesaid this 2nd day of February in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.

87TH CLAUSE OF THE "MUTINY ACT."

Any person who shall in any part of Her Majesty's dominions, by words, or by any other means whatsoever, directly, or indirectly, procure any soldier to desert, or shall by words or by any other means whatsoever attempt to procure or persuade any soldier to desert, and any person who, knowing that any soldier is about to desert, shall aid or assist him in deserting, or knowing any soldier to be a deserter, shall conceal such deserter, or aid or assist such deserter in concealing himself, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to be punished by fine or imprisonment, or both, as the Court before which such conviction shall take place may adjudge.

NORTHERN LIGHTHOUSES.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

NORTH UNST, SHETLAND—TEMPORARY  
LIGHTHOUSE.

The Commissioners of Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice that, with a view to a permanent light being ultimately established in the same locality, a temporary Lighthouse tower has been erected off the North end of the Island of Unst, in Shetland, and that the Light will be exhibited therefrom for the first time on the night of Wednesday, 11th October 1854, and every night thereafter, from the going away of day-light in the evening till the return of day-light in the morning.

The following is a Specification of the Lighthouse, and the appearance of the Light, by Mr. David Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners:

The temporary Lighthouse is erected on Muckle Flugga, being one of the group of rocks called the Burra Fiord Holms, which

lie off the headland of Hermaness, being the northern extremity of the Island of Unst. The Lighthouse is in N. Lat. 60° 51' 20," and W. Long. 0° 53' 3."

The small rock called the "Out Stack," which is the most northern rock of the Shetland Isles, bears from the Lighthouse about E. b. N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. by compass, and is distant about half a nautic mile.

The North Unst Light will be known to Mariners as a FIXED LIGHT, of the natural colour. It is elevated about 165 feet above the level of high water of ordinary spring-tides, and may be seen at the distance of about 19 nautic miles, and at lesser distances according to the state of the atmosphere.

The Commissioners further give notice, that by order in Council, dated the 3d day of July last, the following Tolls are authorised to be levied in respect of the said Lighthouse, viz:—

For every Vessel belonging to the United Kingdom (the same not belonging to Her Majesty, her heirs or successors, nor being navigated wholly in ballast) and for every Foreign Vessel privileged to enter the ports of the United Kingdom upon paying the same duties of Tonnage as are payable by British Vessels which may pass or derive benefit from the Light, the Toll of Two-Sixteenths of a Penny per Ton of the burthen of every such Vessel for every time of passing or deriving benefit therefrom, if on a coasting voyage.

For each time of passing or deriving benefit on an Oversea voyage, One Penny per Ton for every such Vessel.

For every Foreign Vessel not navigated wholly in ballast, and not privileged in manner before specified, double the respective Tolls above set forth.

Which Tolls are liable to the following abatements on payment—for a Coasting Voyage, Ten per cent; for an Oversea Voyage, Twenty-five per cent;
