## NATURALIZATION ACT, 1855.

IN THE NINETEENTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA.

Session 3, No. 1.

#### ANALYSIS.

mble reciting No. 2, Session 2. Persons pamed in Schedule A to be naturalized.

2. Persons may be naturalized by Proclamation.

3. Short title.

AN ACT for the Naturalization of certain Persons in the Colony Title. of New Zealand

[Assented to 15th September, 1855.]

HEREAS by an Act made and passed by the General Preamble reciting Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Naturalization No. 2, Session 2.

Act, 1854," No. 2, Sess. 2; it was among other things enacted, that all and singular the persons who should be declared to come within the operation of the said Act, by any Proclamation to be issued by the Governor, should be deemed and taken, until the next Session of the General Assembly within the Islands of New Zealand, to be natural born subjects of Her Majesty.

AND WHEREAS the persons particularly described in the Schedule marked "A" hereunto annexed, have from time to time been so declared to come within the operation of the said recited Ordinance, and it is expedient that there should be removed from them within the Colony of New Zealand the disabilities to which aliens are by law subjected.

BE IT ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand as follows:

Persons named in Schedule A to be naturalized. 1. All and singular the persons who are particularly described in the Schedule marked "A" to this Act annexed, shall to all intents and purposes whatever within the Colony of New Zealand, be deemed and taken to be, and to have been from the dates set opposite their names respectively, natural born subjects of Her Majesty, as if they had been respectively born within the realm of England.

Persons may be naturalized by Proclamation.

2. And whereas there are certain other persons resident in New Zealand whom it may be expedient to relieve from the disabilities to which them are by law subject, but whose names and descriptions have not been accurately assertanced. Be it further enacted that all and singular the persons who shall be declared to come within the operation of this Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, or Officer administering the Government, shall be deemed and taken until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly to be natural born subjects of Her Majesty within the Islands of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes, as if their names had respectively been inserted in the Schedule hereunto annexed, Provided always that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of the person or persons therein named, and of his or their residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Short title.

3. This Act shall be entitled, and may be cited as "The Naturalization Act, 1855."



### LAND CLAIMANTS' ORDINANCE AMENDMENT ACT, 1855.

IN THE NINETEENTH YEAR OF THE REIGN OF HER MAJESTY QUEEN VICTORIA.

SESSION 3, No. 2.

#### ANALYSIS.

Preamble.

1. Repeal of Clause 16 of New Zealand Company's Land Claimants' Ordinance, Session, XI No. 15.

2. Duty mentioned in repealed Clause to be performed by Colonial Secretary of New Zealand.

3. Short title.

Title.

An Act to amend the New Zealand Company's Land Claimants Ordinance, Session XI, No. 15.

[Assented to September 15th, 1855.]

Preamble.

WHEREAS by an Ordinance made and passed by the Governor-in-Chief of New Zealand, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, entitled "An Ordinance to ascertain the contracts and engagements entered into by the New Zealand Company for the disposal of certain Lands in the Islands of New Zealand, and to provide for the completion of such contracts and engagements by the Colonial Government," after reciting that in certain cases various dealings had been had between the persons claiming title to lands in regard to which the land orders thereinbefore mentioned related, and that for the purpose of preventing injury and inconvenience to persons who might have dealt with such Claimants in respect of the lards so claimed by them, it might be expedient that the legal estate in the land to be comprised in any such grant as therein mentioned, should, in certain cases, be deemed to have been in the grantee prior to the date of such grant, it was enacted that it should be lawful for the Commissioner who should hear and decide any such claim, at his discretion to report that for the purpose aforesaid, it would be expedient that such legal estate should be deemed to have been in such grantee, from and after a date to be named by such Claimant in that And whereas it was by the sixteenth section of the said Ordinance provided, that in every such case it should be the duty Munster, before issuing any such grant, to indorse thereon the date so reported as aforesaid, and the legal estate in the land so be comprised in such grant, should be deemed to have been in the grantee thereof, from the date so to be endorsed as aforesaid. And whereas by virtue of a certain Act of Parliament made and passed in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, entitled "An Act to grant a representative Constitution to the Colony of New of Colonial Secretary for Zealand," office the New Munster ceased to exist. AndProvince of whereas great injury and inconvenience have been sustained by grantees in certain cases, by reason of there being no person duly authorised to make the endorsement by the said recited Ordinance required to be made by the Colonial Secretary for the Province of New Munster. And whereas it is expedient that provisions should be made for remedying and preventing such injury and inconvenience,

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand as follows:

Repeal of Clause 16 1. That clause 16 of the said recited Ordinance shall be of New Zealand Company's Land Claim anta' and the same is hereby repealed.

2. Preamble.

WHEREAS certain acts of the Imperial Parliament, specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, have been passed for the amendment of the Law, and it is expedient that the same be adopted and brought into operation within the Colony:

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly of New Zealand as follows:

Certain Acts adopted.

1. The several Acts of the Imperial Parliament, specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed, shall be taken to extend to this Colony and shall be applied therein in the administration of justice in like manner as Acts of Parliament passed before the establishment of the Colony are applied.

Commoncement of

2. This Act shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1855.

Short title.

3. This Act shall be termed, and may be cited and referred to as "The English Acts Act, 1855."

#### SCHEDULE

Statute 9 and 10 Victoriæ, Cap XXIV, "An Act for removing some defects in the administration of Criminal Justice."

Statute 17 and 18 Victoriæ, Cap CXIII, "An Act to amend the law relating to the administration of the extens of deceased persons."

AN Acr to provide for the Appropriation of the Public Revenues Title. of New Zealand.

(Assented to September 15th, 1855.)

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Parliament Preamble reciting New Zealand Constitution holden in the fifteeuth and sixteenth years of the reign of Act. Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted, that after and subject to the payments to be made under the provisions therein contained, all the Revenues arising from taxes, duties, rates, and imposts levied in virtue of any Act of the General Assembly, and from the disposal of Waste Lands of the Crown, shall be subjected to be appropriated to such specific purposes, as by any Act of the said General Assembly shall be prescribed in that behalf, and that the surplus of such Revenue which shall not be appropriated as aforesaid, shall be divided among the several Provinces in the like proportions as the gross proceeds of the said Revenue shall have arisen therein respectively; but no specific provision has been made by the said recited Act for the appropriation of Her Majesty's Revenue levied under and by virtue of Ordinances made and enacted by the Legislative Council of New Zealand before the passing of the said recited Act. WHEREAS it is expedient that the Revenue arising from the disposal of the Waste Lands of the Crown, and from such Revenues as aforesaid, should be appropriated in manner hereinafter

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the General Assembly as follows:

1. The Public Treasurer of New Zealand shall issue and To be paid by Treasurer under Goverpay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes here-nors warrant. inbefore mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor or the Officer administering the Government, for the time being, by any Warrant to be signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct, and the payment so to be made shall be charged upon and payable out of such Revenues as aforesaid.

3. The surplus of the said Revenues shall be divided among The surplus of said Revenues to be divided the several Provinces established in New Zealand, in the like among the Provinces. proportions as the gross proceeds of the said Revenues shall have arisen therein respectively, and shall be paid over to the respective Treasurers of such Provinces by the Public Treasurer of the Colony, in pursuance of Warrants under the hand of the said Governor or Officer administering the Government, directed to him in that behalf.

Treasurer to be allowed credit for all sums so paid.

4. The said Treasurer shall, in his accounts from time to time, be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such Warrant as aforesaid, and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned.

5. This Act shall be called, and may be cited as "The Appropriation Act, 1855."

#### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS
GORE BROWNE, Companion of the
Most Honorable Order of the
Bath, Governor of the Colony of
New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent as in the said recited Act provided; the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation or any subsequent day to be named therein.

And whereas an Ordinance hath been enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of New Plymouth with the advice and consent of the Provincial

Council thereof, intituled "An Ordinance to declare the non-liability of the Officers of the Provincial Government in respect of engagements entered into by them on behalf of the Provincial Government" Session 2, No. 12, and the said Ordinance was received by the Officer administering the Government on the thirtieth day of June, 1855.

And whereas it is expedient that the said recited Ordinance should be disallowed, now therefore, I the Governor of New Zealand in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby Proclaim and Declare my disallowance of the said recited Ordinance.

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, at Auckland in the Colony aforesaid, in the nineteenth year of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria and on the fourteenth day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty-five.
