PROCEAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS
GORE BROWNE, Companion of the
Most Honorable Order of the
New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

HEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the Reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent as in the said recited Act provided; the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him to declare by Proclamation his disallowance of such Bill and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation or any subsequent day to be named therein.

And whereas an Ordinance hath been endeted by the superintendent of the Province of New Plymouth with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the clearing of Road lines by the owners of land having frontage thereon" Session 2, No. 13, and the said Ordinance was received by the Governor on the fourteenth day of September, 1855.

And whereas it is expedient that the said recited Ordinance should be disallowed, now therefore, I the Governor of New Zasland in pursuance of the authority regard in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament do hereby Proclaim and Declare my disallowance of the said recited Ordinance.
