Sin,—I am directed by the Post Master General to acquaint you for the information of Lord John Russell, that in addition to the

contract concluded with Messrs. Baines & Co., of Liverpool, for the conveyance of the Mails to Australia on the 5th of each month, he has entered into a contract with Messrs. Pelkington and Wilson also of Liverpool, for a like service on the 20th of every month, during the remainder of the present year.

Both contracts provide that Return Mails shall be brought from Australia to Liverpool, and that the dates for the packets to leave Melbourne on the homeward voyage shall be fixed by the Colonial Government at Sydney.

Viscount Canning desires me to request that the Governor of New South Wales may be informed of this provision.

Sir.—I transmit to you herewith a copy of a letter from the Secretary to the Post Master General, reporting that, in addition to the contract concluded with Messrs Baines. & Co., of Liverpool for the conveyance of Mails to Australia, on the 5th of each month, the Post Master has entered into a further contract for a like service on the 20th of every month during the remainder of the present year.

It is further stated, as you will perceive, that both contracts provide that Return Mails

shall be brought from Australia to Liverpool, and that the dates at which the packets shall leave Melbourne on the homeward voyage shall be fixed by the Colonial Government at Sydney.

I regret that the information regarding this further arrangement was not received at this Department from the Post Authorities in time to be communicated to you by the last mail.
