PROCLAMATION.

By his Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

W HEREAS by "The Passengers' Act, 1855," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor of each of Her Majesty's Possessions abroad by any Proclamation to be by him from time to time issued for that purpose to declare what shall be deemed for the purposes of the said Act to be the length of the voyage of any ship carrying passengers from such Possessions to any other place whatsoever, and to prescribe such scale of diet for the use of the passengers during the voyage as he shall think proper, and also to declare what medicines, medical comforts, medical instruments, and other matters shall be deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the passengers during such "Colosial Voyage."

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, under the power and authority in me vested as aforesaid, do hereby proclaim and declare that, for the purposes of the said Act, the length of the voyage for a "Passenger ship," proceeding from any part of the Islands of New Zealand to the undermentioned places respectively shall be determined by the following scale, that is to say,—

	If the ship be propelled by sails alone, or by steam power, not sufficient without the aid of sails, to propel the ship after the rate of five statute miles an hour.	If the ship be propelled either wholly or in aid of sails by steam engines of not less power than sufficient without the aid of sails to propel the ship after the rate of five statute miles an hour.

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And I do further proclaim and declare that the scale of diet for the use of the passengers during the said several voyages shall be in accordance with the 35th Section of "The Passengers' Act, 1855."

And I do lastly proclaim and declare that the medicines, medical comforts, medical instruments, and other matters deemed necessary for the medical treatment of the passengers during the said several voyages, are such as are prescribed by the 43rd and 44th sections of the said Act.

9.--That sheep shall not be allowed to de-pasture on the Hundred of Onehunga except by Special License from the Wardens of the said Hundred; such License to be issued only for certain Districts as the Wardens may deem it just or necessary.

Parties applying for Sheep Licenses to bear in mind that the application shall be accompanied by a recommendation signed by at least two License holders of such District.

Sir,— I am directed by His Excellency the Governor to state that no Mails have been received here by the "Zingari" this time from Otago, Lyttelton, and Wellington; and that on inquiry it appears that Mails were put on board that ship at those three ports; that all the Mails were landed at Nelson, and that to the best of the Captain's belief, the only Mail brought on from Nelson was a Nelson Mail.

His Excellency has directed me to call upon you for a full explanation as far as you are able to give it on this matter, which has been productive of great public inconvenience.

Sir.

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter (date and number as per margin), written by direction of His Excellency the Governor, requesting an explanation as to the non transmission of the Mail from Wellington by "Zingari."

On the Mails arriving here I directed the man having the bags in charge from the Custom House to place in this office those labelled, and those without labels into an adjoining building, as I could not find room for them all.

In mentioning bags without labels, I beg to remark that bags containing newspapers are rarely labelled, and only tied up.

As I had newspapers unsorted and had not time to attend to them and despatch Mails they remained until after the steamer had left, when on opening the bags among others I found the Auckland one, without label, it having been destroyed.

I am aware of the great inconvenience and greater annoyance this has caused the Public, and regret exceedingly it has occurred, and which I can only admit has been caused from the want of the necessary accommodation and room in this office to enable me to carry on its duties in a proper manner. I trust His Excellency will be pleased to consider this a sufficient explanation, and relieve me of any charge of neglect or inattention to the important duties of the Post Office. I think it right to state, that the labels of four Mails, which arrived this day by the "Zingari," had been destroyed.
