## PROCLAMATION.

By his Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE Companion of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Waste Lands Act, 1854," it is provided that if the Superintendent and Provincial Council of any Province shall recommend to the Governor any Regulations for the sale, letting, disposal, and occupation of the Waste Lands of the Crown within such Province, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit, with the advice of his Executive Council, by Proclamation in the New Zealand "Government Gazette," to issue and put in force such Regulations within such Province, on a day to be named in the Gazette in which the same shall be published, not being less than one calendar month from the publication thereof.

AND WHEREAS the Superintendent and the Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury have recommended to me the following Regulations numbered respectively 67 and 68, in substitution for the Clauses bearing the same numbers in the Regulations now in force within the said Province, for the sale, letting, disposal, and occupation of the Waste Lands of the Crown within the said Province.

Now therefore I, the Governor, pursuant to the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act, do hereby, with the advice of the Executive Council, *proclaim* and *issue* the said Regulations numbered respectively 67 and 68 in substitution as aforesaid, and I do hereby *declare* that the same shall come into force on the 15th day of September, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Islands of New Zealand, at Auckland, in the Islands aforesaid, this fourteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-six.

## AMENDED REGULATIONS

*For the Disposal, Sale, Letting, and Occupation of the Waste Lands of the Crown in the Province of Canterbury.*

67. Pasturage Licenses with pre-emptive right in connexion with purchased lands, whether under the Canterbury Association or the Crown, shall, from and after the 1st day of April, one thousand eight hundred and

fifty-six, be taken and deemed to be pasturage licenses over the lands included therein upon the terms of these Regulations with a pre-emptive right over all such land, to be exercised subject to these Regulations as regards notice of application, payment of deposit, purchase money, price of land, and size and shape of blocks. If the land covered by such pre-emptive right shall be included within the limits of a run held by license under clauses 50 and 53, the holder thereof in paying rent for the same may take credit for the amount paid by him in respect of lands covered by such pre-emptive right.

68. Holders of pasturage licenses without pre-emptive right shall be entitled to hold such licenses or to have them renewed upon the terms of their contract with the Canterbury Association or the Crown, as the case may be but if any person holding a license under the Canterbury Association or the Crown shall voluntarily resign the same, he shall be entitled to receive a license under these Regulations, and shall from the date of such exchange hold his run at the rate and on the conditions specified in these Regulations.
