PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand intituled "The Waste Lands Act, 1856," it is enacted that no land acquired from the Aboriginal Inhabitants after the passing thereof shall be open for sale or disposal until the Governor shall have notified by Proclamation in the *New Zealand Government Gazette* that the Native Title has been extinguished over such land.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, Do hereby *Proclaim* and *Notify* that the Native Title has been extinguished over the two several blocks of Land the boundaries whereof are mentioned or described in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, at Auckland, this sixteenth day of January, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven.

SCHEDULE

No. 1.

BOUNDARIES OF THE MARAEKAKAHO BLOCK ;
Estimated to contain 30,000 Acres.

Commencing at the mouth of the Maraekakaho River and running up stream, on the boundary of the land sold last year (the Aoranghi block) to Makaramu, to Aroha, to Waikoukou, whence it runs on shore on the old boundary to Kekakeka, to Paua, Rakauwharoa, Parikaranga, there it falls into

the Mangaonuku and runs down stream to Waiohora, thence it follows the boundaries of the land first sold (Te Hapuku's block, boundaries of December, 1851) as far as to Ahitara o te Houkura, and still follows the old boundary to te Ruakaka, turns there and runs to te Ahipakura, thence to te Pou a whakaarahia, thence to te Waitangitanga, thence to te Waka, thence to te Kaitaha, thence to the Waikoreke, thence to Tiritirimatanga, down which it runs into Ongaru, and there follows the stream to Pokotaringa, running parallel to the Ngaruroro which the boundary crosses running up a gully from the swamp and thence it runs down to te Urua o Makai where it falls into the Ngaruro and runs up the stream till it joins the starting point at the mouth of Maraekakaho.

No. 2.

BOUNDARIES OF THE MATA BLOCK ;
Estimated to contain 16,000 Acres.

Commencing at te Ngakau o Hape, running thence to Taumata o te Mihiroe, thence to te Rou Pungarehu, thence to Hikahika, thence to Waikaka, thence to te Wai o Hinerakai, thence to Taumata o Puku, where it turns and runs along the ridge to Papahuakina, thence to Tauroa, thence to te Motu o Hinerangi thence to the Taurua, thence to Kaiwaka and down the Tukituki to te Ahi Koura, thence across the plain by a trench cut by Mr. F. FitzGerald, Waipuna, and through the middle of the swamp to Karituhenua.

The boundary of the Reserve called "Karaunua's land" begins at Karituhenua and runs in a straight line to te Hau, thence it runs along the ridge to te Kahurangi, where it turns and runs to the Mokoapeke, thence to Wanawana, and thence to te Ngakau o Hape.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the most Honorable Order of the

Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act bearing date the seventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-six, passed by the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the consent of the General Assembly, intituled, "An Act for the Naturalization of certain persons in the Colony of New Zealand," it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all and singular the persons who shall be declared to come within the operation of such Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall be deemed and taken, until the next Session of the General Assembly, to be natural born subjects of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authority in me vested by the said in part recited Act, *do hereby proclaim and declare* that the persons whose names are underwritten shall be deemed and taken to be natural born subjects of Her Majesty from the dates set opposite their names until the next Session of the General Assembly, as fully to all intents and purposes as if their names had been inserted in the Schedule annexed to the said Act.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel **THOMAS GORE BROWNE**, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Resident Magistrates' Courts Extension of Jurisdiction Act, 1856," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, upon the request of the Superintendent of any Province,

by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, to bring the said Act into operation in respect to any Resident Magistrate's Court having jurisdiction within such Province, from and after a certain day to be named in such Proclamation, and to define the Districts within which cases may be heard in such Court under the provisions of this Act.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, upon the request of the Superintendent of the Province of Otago, *do hereby proclaim and declare* that the said recited Act shall come into operation in respect of the Resident Magistrate's Court at Dunedin, in the said Province, from and after the first day of April, in the year, 1857, and that the said Province of Otago shall be the District within which cases may be heard in such Court under the provisions of the said recited Act.

NOTIFICATION.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by an act of the General Assembly intituled the "Waste Lands Act, 1856." I the Governor *do hereby notify to the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury in the said Colony* that the several allotments or parcels of Waste Lands of the Crown situate within the said Province and hereinafter mentioned are required for the use of the General Government of the said Colony for the several purposes respectively specified; **AND** that I **DO** accordingly except the said allotments or parcels of Land from sale and reserve the same to Her Majesty, Her heirs and successors, viz:

1. For a site for public buildings and for Military defence, the Island of Motunau, containing 5 acres.
2. For Military defence, the top of the hill on the North side of the Town of Akaroa containing 20 acres.
3. For a site for public buildings, allotment No. 71 containing 34 perches, situate at Bruce's landing place in the town of Akaroa.
4. For a site for public buildings, allotment No. 96 containing 1 rood and 4 perches, situate at the Middle landing place in the town of Akaroa.
5. For Military defence 20 acres of land at Patiti Point near the town of Timaru.
6. For sites for public buildings sections 25, 26, 30, and 31, containing 1 acre and 13 perches in the town of Timaru.

All which reserves are delineated on maps deposited in the offices of the Colonial Secretary at Auckland, in the said Colony and in the

Waste Lands Office of the said Province of *Circular.*

Commissioners of the Treasury have decided
upon exempting from Income Tax the Divi-
dends payable in this country upon loans con-
tracted by Colonial Governments, and held by
persons wholly resident in the Colonies to
which such Loans belong respectively, upon an
application made to the Commissioners of In-
come Tax accompanied by a declaration that
the owner of the Stock, upon which such Divi-
dends are payable, is solely resident in such
Colony, and that no other person, resident
elsewhere, has any interest or share in such
Dividends.

CAPE RACE LIGHT, NEWFOUNDLAND.

The Lords of the Committee of the Privy
Council for Trade give Notice—

That the Lighthouse recently erected upon
Cape Race (Newfoundland) will be lighted,
and will continue to exhibit

A FIXED WHITE LIGHT,

from sunset to sunrise, on and after the 15th of
December, 1856.

The light will be visible to seaward from
N.E. by E. round by the S.E. and South to
West.

The light is elevated 180 feet above mean
water level of the sea, and may be seen in
clear weather 17 miles from a ship's deck. The
tower is striped red and white vertically. It
stands close to the old beacon, which has been
cut down.
