PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Naturalization Act, 1856," it is enacted, "that all and singular the persons who shall be declared to come within the operation of this Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, or Officer administering the Government, shall, as from the time to be in the respective cases in that behalf specified by such Proclamation, be deemed and taken, until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be, and to have been as from such specified time, natural born subjects of Her Majesty, within the Islands of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if their names had respectively been inserted in the Schedule hereunto annexed. *Provided always* that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling, of the person or persons therein named, and of his or their residence at the date of such Proclamation."

Now, therefore, *I*, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, *do hereby proclaim and declare* that all and singular the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act

from the several dates hereinafter respectively specified, viz.:—

FREDERICK MARTELLO, from the thirty-first day of January, 1855, native of Messina, cabinet maker, residence Waitohi, Province of Nelson.

FREDERICK ALBERT WASHMANN from the thirty-first day of August, 1855, native of Prussia, tailor, residence Nelson.

JOHN CHARLES, from the eighteenth day of March, 1857, native of Sweden, mariner, residence Nelson.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, this twenty-eighth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven.

Referring to preceding Notices of the periods which had been fixed for the examination of Candidates for the Civil Service of India, I now transmit to you a notification, to which you will give all due publicity, of a similar examination which is to take place in July, 1857.

CIVIL SERVICE OF THE EAST INDIA COMPANY.

1. In July, 1857, an examination will take place of candidates for appointments to the Civil Service of the East India Company. Notice will be hereafter given of the days and place of examination.

2. Any natural-born subject of Her Majesty who shall be desirous of entering the Civil Service of the East India Company, will be entitled to be examined at such examination, provided he shall before the 1st of May, 1857, have transmitted to the India Board, Cannon Row, Westminster:—

(a) A certificate of his birth, showing that his age, on the 1st of May, 1857, will be above eighteen years and under twenty-three years.

(b) A certificate, signed by a physician surgeon, of his having no disease, constitutional affection, or bodily infirmity, unfitting him for the Civil Service of the East India Company.

(c) A certificate of good moral character, signed by the head of the school or college at which he has last received his education; or, if he has not received education at any school or college since the year 1854, then such proof of good moral character as may be satisfactory to the Board of Commissioners for the affairs of India.

(d) A statement of those of the branches of knowledge hereinafter enumerated in which he desires to be examined.

3. The examination will take place only in the following branches of knowledge:—

English Language and Literature—

Composition 500

English Literature and History, including that of the

Laws and Constitution ... 1000

Language, Literature, and History of Greece 750

4. The merit of the persons examined will

be estimated by marks, according to the ordinary system in use at several of the Universities; and the number set opposite to each branch in the preceding paragraph denotes the greatest number of marks that can be obtained in respect of it.

5. No candidate will be allowed any marks in respect of any subject of examination, unless he shall obtain, in respect of that subject one-sixth of the number of marks set against that particular subject.

6. The examination will be conducted by means of printed questions and written answers, and by *vivâ voce* examination.

7. After the examination shall have been completed, the marks obtained by each candidate, in respect of each of the subjects in which he shall have been examined, will be added up, and the names of the twelve candidates who shall have obtained a greater aggregate number of marks than any of the remaining candidates will be set forth in order of merit; and those twelve candidates will be appointed to the Civil Service of the East India Company, in the Presidency of Bengal, provided they comply with the regulations in force at the time for the said service.

8. the Commissioners for the affairs of India will be ready to receive, at any time previous to the 1st of May, 1857, the testimonials of persons desirous of being appointed to the office of Examiner: but no such appointment will be made until after the date above mentioned.
