## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel Thomas Gore Browne, Companion of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand and Vice Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**W**HEREAS the land hereinafter mentioned has been acquired by purchase from the Aboriginal inhabitants of New Zealand, and it is expedient that the acquisition thereof should be notified by Proclamation accordingly.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, do hereby proclaim and notify that the Native Title has been extinguished over the several Blocks of Land whereof the boundaries are mentioned or described in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

Given under my hand and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, at Government House at Auckland, this thirteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

## SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND.

DISTRICT OF WHANGAREI,

*Ruarangi Block.*

Estimated to contain 35,000 Acres.

### BOUNDARIES.

A line commencing at Ngatoka at the source of the Stream of Tauraroa, thence down the course of the said Stream to Ruarangi Kaputoki, Kiporo, Papakaranga Whaingaru, Wharewhiti, Waitomo, Wharekawhetu, Taipare, where the river ceases to be the boundary, thence across the Kauri Whakaoo to the Stream of Waiotira, thence down the course of the Waiotira to Pakara-te-wai, thence in a straight line to the Stream Taka-te-aria, thence across the Stream to Ngako o te Hauhau, thence in an Easterly direction till it joins the boundary of the Government Block of Waipu, thence along the back line of the Waipu till it joins the boundary of the lands of the Chief Mate at Ngatoka aforesaid.

*Pakiri Block,*

Estimated to contain 38,000 Acres.

### BOUNDARIES,

A line commencing at Pakiri, thence running inland to Rauporoa, to Ohaukawa, and along the survey line of Mr. Churton, Hori te

more and Kiri, to Huipapa, and along that boundary to Whangaripo, and in the Whangaripo to the Hoteo River, and on to Rataroa, Ngatoka, Kaitoto, and to Paekauri, on reaching Paekauri it runs along the boundary of the land sold to the Queen and on to that branch of Whangateau which is near to Pukekeo, thence along the coast to Te Ti and Omaha even round to Whakatuwhenua, and on till it joins Pakiri. The Island of Hawere also is included in this boundary.

**I**N EXERCISE of the power vested in me by an Ordinance passed by the Lieutenant-Governor of New Zealand with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, Sess. 8, No. 4, intituled "An Ordinance to provide for the management of Savings' Banks," I, Thomas Gore Browne, Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, do hereby nominate and appoint each of the persons hereinafter named to be a Trustee of the Auckland Savings Bank, in addition to the persons appointed to be Trustees of the said Bank, by Warrant, dated 3rd September, 1857.
