ENGLAND—SCILLY ISLANDS.

Fixed Light on Bishop Rock.

The Corporation of the Trinity House of London have given notice, that on or about 1st of September, 1858, a light will be exhibited from the lighthouse in course of erection on Bishop Rock, the South-westernmost of the Scilly group, lying W. $\frac{3}{4}$ N., 4 miles from St. Agnes Island.

The light will be a *fixed white* light, placed at an elevation of 110 feet above the sea at high water, and visible in clear weather at a distance of 14 miles all round the horizon.

The illuminating apparatus will be dioptric or refracting, of the first order.

The light tower stands in lat. $49^{\circ} 52' 30''$ N., long. $6^{\circ} 26' 20''$ west of Greenwich. [All bearings magnetic. Variation $24\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ West in 1857.]
