PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Ordinance for establishing a Supreme Court, Session 3, No. 1, it is provided that there shall be holden Circuit Courts for the despatch of Civil and Criminal business of the Court before one of the Judges thereof, at such places and at such times, as the Governor shall with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation, from time to time appoint.

Now therefore, I, the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and appoint that a Circuit Court

shall be holden before

The Hon. GEORGE ALFRED ARNEY, Chief Justice of the said Court,

at the Town of New Plymouth, on the twentyseventh day of September, inst., or so soon after the said day as conveniently may be.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS
GORE BROWNE, Companion of
the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice Admiral of the same.

HEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him, to declare, by Proclamation, his disallowance of such Bill, and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein.

And whereas the Acts hereinafter specified have been enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Wellington, with the advice and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Acts were received by the Governor on the third day of September, 1858.

And whereas it is expedient that the said

recited Acts should be disallowed.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Acts passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Wellington, viz. :-

"An Act to vest in Trustees certain land in

the Wairarapa District, for the purpose of a Public Race Course," Session VI., No. 4.

"An Act to Incorporate the 'Wellington Steam Navigation Company,' and for other purposes therein named," Session VI., No. 5.
