PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS
GORE BROWNE, Companion of the
most Honorable Order of the
Bath, Governor and Commanderin-Chief in and over Her Majesty's
Colony of New Zealand, and ViceAdmiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act bearing date the eighteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, passed by the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, by and with the consent of the General Assembly, intituled, "An Act for the Naturalization of certain persons in the Colony of New Zealand," it is enacted inter alia that all and singular the persons who shall be declared to come within the operation of such Act, by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall be deemed and taken, until the next Session of the General Assembly, to be natural born subjects of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the powers and authority in me vested by the said in part recited Act, do hereby Proclaim and Declare that the persons whose names are underwritten shall be deemed and taken to be na-

tural born subjects of Her Majesty from the date set opposite their names respectively until the next Session of the General Assembly, as fully to all intents and purposes as if their names had been inserted in the Schedule annexed to the said Act.

Settler, residing at Matamata, from the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty, native of Libourne in France.

Jose Carlos Gomes,

Seaman, residing at Auckland, from the first of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven, native of the Cape de Verde Islands.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS
GORE BROWNE, C.B., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in
and over the Islands of New
Zealand, and Vice Admiral of
the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, 21st and 22nd Victoria, No. 15, intituled the "New Zealand Post Office Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, from time to time, by Proclamation to be published in the New Zealand Gazette, to fix, alter, and abolish the rates of postage at any time payable within the Colony for the transmission of letters by post, either between places within New Zealand, or to or from places beyond seas, and at what time the same shall be paid; and that the postage so made payable shall be charged and paid accordingly.

Now therefore I, the Governor, in pursuance of the said recited authority, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council of New Zealand, do fix the several Rates of Postage, and the times at which the same respectively shall be paid, specified in the Schedule to this Proclamation annexed.

And I do appoint and declare that this Proclamation shall take effect on and after the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

SCHEDULE.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

I.—Inland Letters.

From any part of New Zealand, to any other part of New Zealand.

Pre-paid or not, according to the option of the sender.

A uniform rate according to the following scale:—

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. in weight, 0 2 Exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. not exceeding 1 oz. 0 4

And so on, increasing fourpence for every additional ounce, or fraction of an ounce.

II.—Foreign Letters.

All Postage on Letters addressed to places beyond the Colony, must be pre-paid.

A uniform rate (except where otherwise herein specially provided) according to the following scale:—

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. ... 0 6 Exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. not exceeding 1 oz. 1 0 And so on, increasing one shilling for every additional ounce, or fraction of an ounce.

NOTE.

Letters sent to or by Seamen and Soldiers in Her Majesty's Service, and in the Service of the East India Company, will be transmitted within the Colony; and between the Colony and any Post Office in the British Dominions, at a charge of one penny provided the following regulations are observed:—

1st, Each letter must not exceed ½ ounce, in weight.

2nd, It must be superscribed with the name of the writer, his description or class in the Vessel or Regiment, and signed by the Officer at the time in command.

3rd, The Postage must be pre-paid.

[Any letter of this description posted or received in the Colony, not in accordance with the foregoing regulations, will be treated as an ordinary letter.]

III.

Special rates payable on certain Letters, in addition to the ordinary rate of Foreign Postage, of 6d, per ½ ounce.

Not exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. ... 0 6 Exceeding $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. and not exceeding 1 oz. ... 1 0

And so on, increasing one shilling for every additional ounce, or fraction of an ounce.

Letters forwarded viâ the United Kingdom, to the under-mentioned Colonies and Foreign Countries.

[The postage upon these Letters must in all cases be paid in advance, and in addition to the sums specified in this Table the rate of postage for the conveyance of these mails from New Zealand to the United Kingdom must be collected by the Colonial Post Office.]

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

NEW RIVER HARBOUR, FOVEAUX STRAITS.

"Invercargill, 30th October, 1858. " SIR,-The New River pilot having communicated to me the following information I lose no time in forwarding the same to your Honor.

"1st, The palot states that the channel at the entrance of the New River (in which at low water springs, Mr. Thomson, chief surveyor, found from sixten to eighteen feet two years ago) is gradually filling up, so that two months ago the pilot could only find nine feet,

and about a fortnight ago only six feet.

"2nd, That a new channel (at present the only one) has opened up about two cables length to the north-west of the former one, in which the pilot found, when he last sounded, fifteen feet at low water: where this channel now exists there were formerly only a few feet.

" I have taken steps to apprise the commanders of the whalers which frequent the River of the change; which I trust may prevent them Stephenson Smith,' for 'Henry Launcelot Redmaking an attempt to enter the River by the head' read 'Henry Launcelot Redhead.'

old channel, which attempt would certainly be attended with serious consequences to vessels of their draught.

" Strangers will not likely attempt to enter without a pilot; but as a recent instance occurred in which a stranger did so enter, I would respectfully suggest that, to prevent accident, all publicity should be given to the above report.

"I indulge a hope that this new channel which has so suddenly made its appearance, and is much wider than the old one, will continue to increase in depth, and thus make the Port of New River much more easy of access than it has hitherto been.
