PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS the Land hereinafter mentioned has been acquired by purchase from the Aboriginal Inhabitants of New Zealand, and it is expedient that the acquisition thereof should be notified by Proclamation accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, do hereby proclaim and notify that the Native Title has been extinguished over the Block of Land whereof the Boundaries are mentioned or described in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony, at Government House, at Auckland, this 28th day of December, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight.

SCHEDULE.

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND.

District of Kaipara.

Kaukapakapa East Block, estimated to contain 7200 Acres.

BOUNDARIES.

A line commencing at Whakatiwai, at te Maioro, by the side of Kaukapakapa river, thence along the surveyed line to Waikiekie, thence along the Kaipara river to Wharewhakarato, it then runs inland seventy four degrees, forty minutes, (74° 40') nine thousand eight hundred and ninety nine (9899) links to Ruio-totara and Ohoia, thence to Otuakopuai and Rongomaimatua, seventy nine degrees, twenty minutes, (79° 20') ten thousand eight hundred (10,800) links, thence to Waitoki, to Parekahau boundary, eighty degrees, thirty six minutes, (80° 36') two thousand and twenty seven (2027) links, it then runs along the course of Kaukapakapa river to Kotowhiki, te Waikakaruhe, Onapu, Otuhare, till it reaches Whakatiwai at te Maioro at the point of commencement.

AT GOVERNMENT HOUSE, AT AUCKLAND,
THE 1ST DAY OF JANUARY, 1859.

Present:—

His Excellency the Governor in Council.

WHEREAS by the Customs Regulation, Act, 1858, it is provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council by Order in Council, published in the New Zealand Ga-

zette, from time to time to suspend during such time as may appear expedient, the operation of any provision of the said Act, either throughout the Colony, or in or at any particular district or port to be defined or specified for the purpose; and also to continue in force during such time as may appear expedient, any provisions of any Ordinance by the said Act expressed to be repealed.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the Advice and Consent of his Executive Council, doth by this present Order, suspend from the day of the date hereof, until the 30th day of June, 1859, the operation of Sections 127, 128, and 129 of the said Act throughout the Colony of New Zealand, and doth continue in force during such period the operation of section 53 of an Ordinance enacted by the Governor of New Zealand with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, intituled "An Ordinance to repeal within the said Colony of New Zealand, an Act of the Governor and Council of New South Wales passed in the third year of Her present Majesty's Reign, intituled 'An Act to repeal an Act relating to the Revenue of Customs in New South Wales, and to provide for the general regulation thereof;' and also, a certain other Act of the said Governor and Council of New South Wales, passed in the fourth year of the Reign of Her said present Majesty, Queen Victoria, intituled, 'An Act for increasing the duties on spirits, wine, and other goods and merchandize imported into the Colony of New South Wales and its dependencies;' and which said Acts of the Governor and Council of New South Wales were adopted, and are now in force within the said Colony of New Zealand and its dependencies; and to make provision for the collection of certain duties on goods imported into, and for the general regulation of, the Revenue of Customs in the Colony of New Zealand and its dependencies."
