PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act made and enacted in the Imperial Parliament holden in the fifteenth and sixteenth years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, intituled "An Act to grant a Representative Constitution to the Colony of New Zealand," it is amongst other things enacted that whenever any Bill shall have been assented to by the Superintendent as in the said Act provided, the Superintendent shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an authentic copy thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time within three months after any such Bill shall have been received by him, to declare, by Proclamation, his disallowance of such Bill, and that any such disallowance shall make void and annul the same from and after the day of the date of such Proclamation, or any subsequent day to be named therein.

And whereas the Ordinances hereinafter specified have been enacted by the Superintendent of the Province of Canterbury, with the advice

and consent of the Provincial Council thereof, and the said Ordinances were received by the Governor on the 11th day of January, 1859.

And whereas it is expedient that the said recited Ordinances should be disallowed,

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of New Zealand, in pursuance of the authority vested in me in that behalf by the said recited Act of Parliament, do hereby proclaim and declare my disallowance of the following Ordinances passed by the Superintendent and Provincial Council of the Province of Canterbury, viz. :-

"The Immigrants' Barracks Ordinance, Sess. x., No. 2."

"The Public Hospital Ordinance, Sess. x., No. 6."

Given under my hand, and issued under the Public Seal of the Colony of New Zealand, at Government House, at Auckland, in the Colony aforesaid, this 26th day of January, in the year of Our Lord, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME GREETING :

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand, from time to time to appoint Polling places for each Electoral District within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the Principal Polling Place for the District, and all or any of such Polling Places at any time to abolish, and appoint other Polling Places in lieu thereof. **AND** WHEREAS by another Act of the General Assembly intituled "The Provincial Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that, subject to certain provisions therein contained, all the provisions of "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," shall apply to the Elections of Superintendents and Members of Provincial Councils.

NOW KNOW YE that I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Acts, do hereby appoint the following places to be the Polling Places for the District of the Southern Division of the Province of Auckland for the Election of Members of the Provincial Council of the said Province, namely,—

- At Onehunga.*—The Court House.
- At Panmure.*—The Ferry House,
- At Howick.*—The Court House.
- At Otahuhu.*—The Police Station.
- At Waiheke.*—Such place on that Island as the Deputy Returning Officer may name.
- At Waiuku.*—The Resident Magistrate's Station.
- At Coromandel.*—The Post Office.
- At Papakura.*—The Resident Magistrate's Station.
- At Rangiawhia.*—The Resident Magistrate's Station.
- At Kawhia.*—The Custom House.
- At Raglan.*—The Resident Magistrate's Station.

and I do further appoint the Polling Place at Onehunga to be the Principal Polling Place for the said District.
