**PROCLAMATION.**

By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Naturalization Act, 1858," it is enacted that "every Person who shall be declared to come within the operation of this Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken, until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be and to have been, from such specified time, a natural-born Subject of Her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule hereunto annexed. Provided always, that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of every Person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation."

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Person hereinafter mentioned, shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the date hereinafter specified, viz.,

CHRISTIAN LAURITZEN THYSTRUP.

From the First day of November, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight, Native of Denmark,

**WHEREAS** the Land hereinafter mentioned has been acquired by purchase from the aboriginal inhabitants of New Zealand, and it is expedient that the acquisition thereof should be notified by Proclamation accordingly:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor, do hereby proclaim and notify that the Native Title has been extinguished over the Block of Land whereof the boundaries are mentioned or described in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

PROVINCE OF AUCKLAND. DISTRICT OF KAIPARA.

Pukekaroro Block, containing 8,458 acres.

BOUNDARIES.

The boundary commences at Kaiwaka, at the place where the Ika-a-ranganui boundary-line crosses that river; thence following the course of Kaiwaka to Koangatoko to the boundary of Mr. Grahame's claim, thence by line bearing  $354^{\circ} 283'00$  links, and straight on to the Wairau river; thence, along the Wairau in an Easterly direction to Mr. Wilson's survey line; thence, by a number of short survey lines, bearing as follows:— $355^{\circ} 30'$  1030 links,  $34^{\circ} 408$  links,  $330^{\circ} 21'$  500 links,  $333^{\circ} 300$  links,  $346^{\circ} 980$  links,  $348^{\circ} 30'$  240 links,  $286^{\circ} 54'$  351 links,  $247^{\circ} 30'$  706 links,  $287^{\circ} 25'$  310 links,  $272^{\circ} 30'$  532 links,  $285^{\circ} 488$  links,  $271^{\circ} 9'$  396 links,  $236^{\circ} 30'$  500 links,  $282^{\circ} 51'$  537 links,  $234^{\circ} 1160$  links,  $297^{\circ} 51'$  475 links,  $310^{\circ} 15'$  405 links,  $268^{\circ} 30'$  546 links,  $37^{\circ} 42'$  1000 links,  $353^{\circ} 10'$  281 links,  $31^{\circ} 21'$  982 links,  $353^{\circ} 45'$  382 links,  $23^{\circ} 20'$  720 links,  $35^{\circ} 305$  links,  $63^{\circ} 48'$  480 links,  $202^{\circ} 403$  links,  $241^{\circ} 51'$  352 links,  $212^{\circ} 30'$  383 links; thence by a line bearing  $306^{\circ} 45'$  163' 83 links, to the boundary-line of Ika-a-ranganui, thence, by that boundary-line bearing  $51^{\circ} 45'$  336'60 links, to Matawerohia, thence by the line bearing  $12^{\circ} 8'$  3975 links, to Kaiwaka, where the boundary closes.

50 acres, situated on Kaiwaka, at Koangatoko, has been reserved for Arama Karaka which is coloured yellow on the plan in the margin of the Deed.

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING :

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor by Warrant under his hand, from time to time to appoint Polling Places for each Electoral District within or without the limits thereof, and to appoint any one of such places to be the Principal Polling Place for the District, and all or any of such Polling Places at any time to abolish and to appoint other Polling Places in lieu thereof: And Whereas by another Act of the General Assembly, intituled "The Provincial Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that, subject to certain provisions therein contained, every Election of the Superintendent or of a Member of the Provincial Council of a Province shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by the "Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," aforesaid, and all the provisions of the said last mentioned Act shall apply to the Elections of Superintendents and Members of Provincial Councils:

**REPORT of JOSIAH FLIGHT, Esquire, of the Province of Taranaki, under the "New Zealand Native Reserves Act, 1856."**

**RESERVE No. 1.**

The Natives whose names are given below having the right to fifty-six acres of this Reserve, and being desirous of bringing the same under the operation of the said Act, have executed a conveyance of the same in favour of Her Majesty. The Reporter has therefore the honor to recommend that such portion of the Reserve as is delineated in the plan drawn in the margin of the Deed of Conveyance sent herewith should be brought under the operation of the said Act.

**S**IR,—I am directed by the Postmaster-General to inform you that, in consequence of the War which has broken out, the Austrian Packets hitherto plying between Alexandria and Trieste have been withdrawn, and Letters, &c. cannot be forwarded to the United Kingdom, or the Continent of Europe, via Trieste.

You will no doubt consider it advisable to give public notice of this circumstance, and will discontinue, for the present, making up a

Mail for the Austrian Post Office at Alexandria.

**S**IR,—With reference to my letter of the 25th June, 1858, in which I requested you to forward in the Mail for Alexandria, Letters, &c., addressed to the Ionian Islands, in order that they might be sent to their destination via Trieste, I am directed by the Postmaster-General to inform you that, as the Austrian Packets between Trieste and Corfu have been withdrawn for the present, Her Majesty's Government, with a view to keeping up a communication with the Ionian Islands, have concluded a Contract with the Peninsular and Oriental Steam Navigation Company for the re-establishment of a branch Packet, to proceed twice a month, between Malta and Corfu. All Letters, &c., for the Ionian Islands reaching your office should in future be forwarded in your Mail for Malta. If, however, you do not make up a Mail for Malta, the Letters must be sent in your Mail for the British Office at Alexandria.

In consequence of this alteration of route, Letters for the Ionian Islands dispatched from your office will henceforth be liable to a British sea rate of fourpence only per half-ounce, and newspapers to a British sea rate of one penny each.
