By His Excellency Colonel THOMAS GORE BROWNE, Companion of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Her Majesty's Colony of New Zealand, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Naturalization Act, 1858," it is enacted that "all and singu'ar the persons who shall be declared to come within the operation of this Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, or Officer Administering the Government, shall, as from the time to be in the respective cases in that behalf specified by such Proclamation, be deemed and taken, until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be and to have been, from such specified time, as natural-born subjects of Her Majesty within the Islands of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes as if their names had respectively been inserted in the Schedule hereunto annexed. Provided always, that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling of the person or persons therein named, and of his or their residence at the date of such Proclamation."

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare that the persons here-

after mentioned, shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the several dates hereinafter respectively specified, viz.:

THOMAS TOPP,

From the tenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-eight; Native of Germany; Farmer; Residence Province of Nelson.

NICHOLAS PAUL BALTHASAR VON TUNZELMANN,

From the nineteenth day of May, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine; Native of Russia; Settler; Residence Napier, Province of Hawkes' Bay.

WALTER PILLIET,

From the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine; Native of France; Surveyor; Residence Napier, Province of Hawkes' Bay.

EULOGIE REIGNIER,

From the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and fifty-seven; Native of France; Roman Catholic Priest; Residence Napier, Province of Hawkes' Bay.

WHEREAS by an Act of the General Assembly of New Zealand, intituled "The Naturalization Act, 1858," it is enacted that "every person who shall be declared to come within the operation of this Act by any Proclamation to be issued in that behalf by His Excellency the Governor, shall, as from the time in such Proclamation specified, be deemed and taken, until the termination of the next Session of the General Assembly, to be and to have been, from such specified time, a natural born subject of her Majesty within the Colony of New Zealand, as fully to all intents and purposes, as if his name had been inserted in the Schedule hereunto annexed: Provided always, that every such Proclamation shall contain the description, occupation, or calling, of every person therein named, and his place of residence at the date of such Proclamation.

Now, therefore, I, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Act, do hereby proclaim and declare, that the persons hereinafter mentioned shall come within the operation of the said Act, from the several dates hereinafter respectively specified, viz.,

ADOLPH BING,

From the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine; Native of Germany; Merchant; Residence, Wellington, Province of Wellington.

JOHN FREDERICK SCHÖTTLER,

From the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine; Native of Prussia; Cabinet-maker; Residence, Auckland, in the Province of Auckland.

AUGUSTE SCHÖTTLER,

Wife of the said John Frederick Schöttler; from the said first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine; Native of Prussia; Residence, Auckland, Province of Auckland.

the General Assembly, intituled "The Provincial Elections Act, 1858," it is enacted that, subject to certain provisions therein contained, every Election of the Superintendent or of a Member of the Provincial Council of a Province shall be conducted in the manner prescribed by the "Regulation of Elections Act, 1858," aforesaid, and all the provisions of the said last mentioned Act shall apply to the Elections of Superintendents and Members of Provincial Councils:

NOW KNOW YE, that I, Thomas Gore Browne, the Governor of the said Colony, in pursuance of the power and authority in me vested by the said Acts, do hereby appoint the following place to be a Polling Place for the District of Clutha for the Election of the Superintendent and of Members of the Provincial Council of the Province of Otago namely:

THE SCHOOL-ROOM AT INCH CLUTHA, instead of the School-house, Clutha, as appointed by Warrant dated the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

WHEREAS by "The Gold Duty Act, 1858," it is enacted that from and after the day on which the Act now in recital should come into operation, there should be levied, collected, and paid to Her Majesty, Her Heirs, and Successors, for the public uses of the Colony, and in support of the Government thereof, the following Duty upon Gold; that is to say,—At the Customs, previous to Exportation from New Zealand, the sum of two shillings and sixpence upon every Ounce Troy Weight of such Gold, and so on in proportion for any greater or less quantity than an Ounce: Provided always, that until the then next session of the General Assembly, it should be lawful for the Governor, by an order in Council, to declare that a lower rate of Duty than two shillings and sixpence should be collected on each Ounce; and also from time to time to suspend the collection of such duty whenever to the Governor in Council it should seem meet:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of his Executive Council, doth by this present Order

suspend the collection of the said Duty, as from the time of the coming into operation of the said Act, until such time as shall hereafter be appointed by his Excellency, by and with such advice and consent as aforesaid.

Robert Simpson Thomson	Whau	These are claims under pre-emption certificates Nos. 154 and 171 in favour of claimant for 800 acres and 900 acres respectively. Commissioner Matson, 23rd June, 1848, recommended the issue of a Grant for 500 acres.
George Hart	Papakura	This is a claim under pre-emption certificate No. 121, dated 3rd January 1845, for 850 acres in favour of claimant. Disallowed 15th June, 1848.
Mary Kelly	Waitemata	This is a claim under pre-emption certificate No. 129, dated 14th January 1845, for 800 acres in favour of John Fair, who was afterwards drowned. On the application of the widow, Mary Fair, Governor Fitzroy consented to the certificate being made out in the name of the widow and her eldest son, jointly, for 800 acres.
Adam Chisholm	Papakura	This is a claim under pre-emption certificate No. 120, dated 3rd January 1845, in favour of claimant for 1000 acres. Disallowed 15th June, 1848.
Adam Chisholm	Lucas' Creek	This is a claim under pre-emption certificate No. 94, dated 17th December, 1844, in favour of claimant for 1200 acres. Disallowed 15th June, 1848.
Adam Chisholm	Lucas' Creek	This is a derivative claim under pre-emption certificate No. 91, dated 9th December, 1844, in favour of John Alfred Langford for 25' acres. Disallowed 15th June, 1848.
Adam Chisholm	Waiheki	This is a claim under pre-emption certificate No. 146, dated 14th January, 1845, in favour of Adam Chisholm, for 850 acres.
Francis White	Near Kororareka, Bay of Islands	This was a claim of A. V. De Sentis, 323d Commissioner Godfrey recommended no grant, 1st December 1842, claimant not appearing. De Sentis transferred 11 acres to James Hamilton, who transferred to John Kelly, from whom the present claimant derives.
Francis White	An Islet called Motiti, Hokianga	This was an original land claim, No. 243, of William White. Commissioners Richmond and Godfrey, 15th May 1843, recommended a grant to William White. Not acted upon.

James Busby	Ngunguru	This is a claim for 4000 acres alleged to have been purchased from the Natives in 1840 on behalf of claimant, Gilbert Mair and William Lewington. The claim was notified to the Sydney Government by claimant on the 7th January, 1841, but not referred to the Commissioners for investigation.
John Logan Campbell	Waiheki	This is a claim under pre-emption certificate No. 76, dated 5th December, 1844, in favour of Brown and Campbell for 300 acres. Commissioner Matson reported 21st May, 1848, that the survey had not been sent in; claim thereupon disallowed 6th April, 1848.
John Logan Campbell	Onohunga	This is a derivative claim under pre-emption certificate No. 24 in favour of Thomas Jackson. Jackson sold 50 acres to T. Henry. £43 6s. 11d. was offered by the Government as compensation, and refused.
John Logan Campbell	North Head	This is a derivative claim from Henry Tayler (otherwise Abell) No. 212 and 221a. of H. Tayler and A. B. Spark. Commissioners Richmond and Godfrey, in their report 2nd May, 1842, recommended a grant of 117 acres elsewhere; and in their amended report, 10th November 1843, recommended no grant, the maximum quantity having been awarded to the claimants. Land scrip for £1000 was granted but not exercised. £116 10s. compensation offered, but refused. One moiety claimed by Daere.
Ranulph Daere	North Head	This is a derivative claim from Henry Tayler (otherwise Abell) No. 212 and 221a. of H. Tayler and A. B. Spark. Commissioners Godfrey and Richmond's report of 2nd May, 1842, recommended 117 acres to be granted elsewhere; and in their amended report, 10th November 1843, recommended no grant, the maximum quantity having been awarded. Scrip for £1000 was granted, but not exercised; subsequently £116 10s. compensation offered but refused. One moiety claimed by Campbell.
Andrew Rooney	Waitemata	This is a derivative claim under preemption certificate No. 247, dated 12th November, 1845, in favour of Daniel Clucas, for 800 acres. Claim disallowed 23rd May, 1849.
John Nicolson	Kororareka	This was an original claim of J. A. Duvanchelle, 327b. Commissioner Godfrey, 1st December 1842 recommended no grant, claimant not appearing.
Arthur Willis	Piako	This was an original claim of W. E. Cormack, No. 73 and 73b. Commissioner Godfrey, 17th June, 1844, reported in favour of claimant for 2560 acres, provided the boundaries were pointed out by the Natives. No grant issued.
Arthur Willis	Piako	This is a derivative claim 149 of D. F. Macky, who derived from W. E. Cormack claim No. 73 and 73b. Commissioner Godfrey, in his report dated 17th June, 1844, recommended no grant. Cormack having already received the maximum award of 2560 acres; but no grant issued to Cormack.
Arthur Willis	Piako	This is a derivative claim 207b, Gordon Sandeman who derived from W. E. Cormack 73 and 73b. Commissioner Godfrey, 17th June 1844, recommended no grant, the maximum quantity having been already awarded to Cormack; but no grant issued to him.
Arthur Willis	Piako	This was a claim of Gordon Sandeman, 207c., who derived from W. E. Cormack 73 and 73b. Commissioner Godfrey, 1st July 1843, recommended no grant, claimant not appearing.
Arthur Willis	Waipuna, Waikato Harbour	This was an original claim of W. E. Cormack, 73d. Claim not investigated by former Commissioners.
Arthur Willis	Hakehake, Waipa	This was an original claim, 207a, of Gordon Sandeman. Returned by Commissioner Spain, never advertised for hearing.
Arthur Willis	Te Auta	This was an original claim No. 73c, of W. E. Cormack, and 207e Gordon Sandeman. Returned by Commissioner Spain, never advertised for hearing.
Arthur Willis	Mangapori	This was an original claim No. 207d of Gordon Sandeman. Returned by Commissioner Spain, never advertised for hearing.
Arthur Willis	Puketarata, Waipa	This was an original claim of W. E. Cormack, 73a, and Gordon Sandeman. 207. Returned by Commissioner Spain, never advertised for hearing.

Arthur Willis	Matata, Bay of Plenty	This was an original claim of G. W. White, No. 502b. Commissioner Godfrey 30th September, 1844, recommended a Grant to the claimant for half of 904 acres. No Grant issued.
John Makepeace	Kaipara	This was an original claim No. 156, 156a, and 156b, Commissioner Godfrey 2nd May 1844 recommended no grant, claimant not having appeared. Excuse for non-appearance admitted, and notification filed under the Act.
Joseph Newman	Tamaki	This is a claim under Pre-emption Certificate No. 148 dated 16th November, 1844, in favour of Claimant for 300 acres. Claimant not having come forward with his witnesses on the day appointed for the hearing, Commissioner Matson informed the Government that he had no report to make on the case. Claim thereupon disallowed.
John Joseph Moore	Head of the Waitemata river	This is a claim under Pre-emption Certificate No. 71, dated 5th December, 1844, for 1000 acres in favour of Claimant. Commissioner Matson reported 13th May, 1848, that Claimant had not sent in a survey. Disallowed 12th June, 1848.
George Russell, and the heirs-at-law of Alexander Grey	Kororareka	This was an original claim No. 322, for two pieces of land on Kororareka Beach. Commissioner Godfrey 26th November, 1842 recommended a Grant for 1½ acres to the Representatives of the late Alexander Grey, deceased. No Grant issued.
Martha Simpson	Waiheki	This was an alleged purchase from the Natives, by the late Capt. Beckford Simpson. Claim not investigated before a former Commissioner. Claim notified to the Government 24th October, 1855.
Edward Powell	Kaipara	This was an original Land Claim No. 292 and 292a. Commissioner Godfrey recommended no Grant 2nd May 1844; fees not being paid.
Alexander Dalziel	Awaroa	This was an original Land Claim No. 77 and 77a. Commissioners Richmond and Godfrey 2nd May, 1842, recommended a Grant for 194 acres, or any other land of average value. Governor Fitzroy ordered a Grant to be prepared in respect of Claims No. 77 and 77a for 1448 acres. Not acted upon.
